### **Funding Requests**

- Girls Softball is asking for \$2,000 to help finance a new outfield fence for the JV field and will also purchase a new batting cage net and protective screen.
- Craig Mazza asked for a group vote. All approve.
- Peter Toutenhoofd (Physical Education teacher) spoke to the group about a funding request for a class that he started to teach called **Outdoor and Adventurous Experiences**. A description of the class is below:

OUTDOOR AND ADVENTUROUS EXPERIENCES Grades 10, 11, & 12 Semester Course - 1/2 credit Prerequisites: None Regular Adventure Ed is focused on the stages of relationships and group development through unique and novel physical activities that are designed to teach people about things like communication skills, conflict resolution, and problem solving, while being accountable for the group outcomes. Outdoor Ed takes place outside and our pursuits will be about traveling from point A to point B without the use of motorized vehicles. Activities might include, but are not limited to recreational boating (e.g. kayaking, canoeing, sailing, rowing, paddle boarding), hiking, backpacking, fishing, orienteering/geocaching, ice skating, skateboarding, snow or water skiing, snowboarding, snowshoeing, surfing, bouldering/traversing/climbing, mountain biking, adventure activities and ropes courses. Selection of activities depends on the environmental opportunities. A culminating activity may include camping with many of those activities offered or a parent invite to any of the topics covered in the course with students leading the charge to share their knowledge.

- The funding request would help purchase equipment. A rock wall is located in the Redwing Gym and Peter is looking for a covering for the rock wall. The covering would cover the bottom 6 ft. It would be made from a special vinyl and would have South High logos on it. Approximate cost \$2,300.
- The funding request would also help pay for transportation to Devil's Lake. The students are planning a trip to Devil's Lake and will need to take a bus. They would like to take a Coach Bus – approximate cost \$1,200.
- Craig Mazza asked for a group vote. All approve.

Carol Senkbeil motioned to close the meeting and Char Hinze 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion. All approve.
