## Good morning!

On to today's tip...a throw-in in the front court and it is passed to a teammate near the division line who catches the ball with both feet off the floor permits the player to make a normal landing and the feet may come down anywhere, just the same as if the division line does not exist (Rule 9.9.3). The key is that the ball is caught with both feet off the floor.

Take a look at a scenario <u>here</u> (thanks Terry Gleason for the clip)

Violation or not? We could sit in a meeting and discuss/argue about whether she caught the ball with both feet off the floor for an hour. I have her catching the ball in the air and I would argue that if is that close or we have to look at it in slow-motion or pause it, the play is legal.

Also, remember that team control on a throw-in does *not apply to a back court violation,* just for team control fouls.

BTW...the announcers here must be relatives of Jay Bilas!!! Frankie did not miss it!

Friday extra: When a player is disqualified with 5 fouls, we *must* tell the coach even if a sub is already at the table to replace that player. The reason is that the coach could claim that he/she was never told and may try to put the player back in the game. We need to avoid that situation and can easily be done by telling the coach.
