Today's technology can be frustrating to navigate but it also can bring carriage driving right into our homes, if you know where to look (and listen).

Podcasts are like talk radio, on the internet. Almost any subject can be found in podcast form and are often free, being produced by anyone with a computer and microphone. Listening on your computer, tablet, or smart phone, are the most popular ways of listening and can be live-streamed or downloaded (to listen on the go) onto your device.

One of the most successful, and longest running horse podcast producer is The Horse Rodeo Network (HRN). HRN offers hours of listening with shows of all styles; dressage, racing, horsemanship, a daily show (5 days a week), driving, and others.

Our own Brass Oak Driving member, Diane Kastama has appeared several times on the Driving Radio Show (episodes 119 and 148 and I think a few others). The Driving show used to have a new episode every week but is now two times a month having given up two of its shows to the WEG show which is covering the World Equestrian Games being held in Tyron North Carolina next year.

The best part of podcasts are being able to go back in "history" and listen to any that have been made. Apple and Droid App stores only holds 100 episodes, but any older than that can be found on HRN web page. The Driving Radio show can be found at <u>drivingradioshow.horseradionetwork.com</u>, The Horse Radio Network App, or where ever you download music.

If your looking for lessons to improve you and your horse, Coachman's Delight (Andy Marcoux) offers online classes on a variety of subjects. For \$25, you can watch his 90 minute class live (made up of slides, photos and detailed drawings) and ask questions. If you are unable to sit in on the live presentation, he will send a link to watch and review. You will also receive class notes and exercises to do with your horse. True, its not quite as good as having instant feedback from a trainer, in person, but I have found his classes to be beneficial to both Jacopo and myself. Sometimes we just want to watch a carriage driving show like some people watch football or golf. More and more shows are live-streaming and most can be viewed later on their website or YouTube. Some shows have a commentator, and others just show the footage.

Ride On Video (<u>rideonvideo.net</u> or their YouTube channel) video horse events up and down the west coast. They have videos from the west coast Combined Driving Events; Inavale, Shady Oaks, Sargent, and Clay Station. They only post video of people who have paid for the service, but it is a sampling of the dressage, marathon, and cones courses. You will find some familiar faces in the videos!

Post Time Studios, Misdee Wrigley Millers production company, live-streamed this year's Kentucky Classic CDE and has over 10 hours of viewing pleasure of the event and is narrated. This too can be found on Youtube by searching for Post Time Studios.

The United States Equestrian Federation (<u>usef.org</u>) is always live-streaming horse events, including this years Devon Horse Show. Some of it was narrated and some wasn't and the camera work could have been cleaner, but never-the-less it was fun to watch the Coaching and other Pleasure classes. To look up some of the classes, go to <u>usef.org</u> and type in "driving" and "coaching" to see some of the classes.

Though, not a complete list, I hope that you check out some of these driving entertainment resources and find your own to add to the list.

President Lilla Hewitt called the meeting to order at 7:12 p.m.

*Minutes* – The minutes from the September 20<sup>th</sup> meeting were approved as presented.

**Treasurer's Report** – Gloria presented the Treasurer's Report prepared by Linda Fairbanks, on file. The Fall Playday at Overlook Driving Center held on October 15 & 16 reported an income of \$395.00, with expenses of \$75.00, for a total profit of \$320.00. It was noted that this event was a huge success and participants appreciated the exciting and fun obstacles set up by Linda and her crew.

#### Old Business -

<u>Dressage/Pleasure Driving Show in 2018 at Paso Robles Horse Park</u> – Diane Kastama reported that there are no dates available at the Horse Park in April or May of next year. Dates in March or late June might not be suitable due to weather extremes.

Aleks, Volunteer Coordinator, reported he had contacted the Parkfield 4-H group about the possible show in 2018 and that they had volunteered to help wherever needed.

An email addressed to club members from Linda Fairbanks was read. It stated that in her opinion, it is too late in the year to be planning an important show for next spring. We could consider dates in the fall so there is sufficient time for competitors to prepare and to advise trainers and suppliers of the event. Dates in October of next year could also be a problem due to the fact that Diane is planning on competing in the World Championships in the Netherlands.

Discussion resulted in the decision to set up a date in 2019 for this show. This would give plenty of time to review good available dates at the Horse Park and lock them in early.

<u>Christmas Party 2017</u> – Gloria reported that arrangements have been made with the Paso Robles Golf Club to hold the club's Christmas party on Wednesday, December 20<sup>th</sup>. A buffet dinner will be served at 6:00 p.m. at a cost of about \$23/person, including tax and tip. It was agreed the club would pay the \$200 room rental fee. Further details will be provided in our newsletters and emailed flyers.

#### New Business -

<u>New Member</u> – Gloria announced we have a new member, Joni Springer of Paso Robles, who joined at the recent October playday. She drives a Morgan horse.

<u>Board Elections for 2018</u> – Nominations are needed for Board positions of President, Vice President, Treasurer, Secretary and 3 Members at Large. Board elections are held each November and are scheduled at our next meeting. Our current Board was polled to see if they would be willing to run again, along with other nominees. Each agreed to run again but we encourage other members to consider volunteering. An email will be sent to all members asking for nominations.


