## 2022 Primary elections

The 2022 primary elections will be on **March 1, 2022.**

Early voting runs from February 14, 2022 through February 25, 2022.

### Voting by mail

You may vote early by mail if you are registered to vote and meet one of the following criteria:

1. 65 years of age or older on Election Day
2. Sick or disabled
3. Expected to give birth within three weeks before or after Election Day
4. Away from the county of residence on Election Day and during the early voting period
5. Confined in jail, but eligible to vote

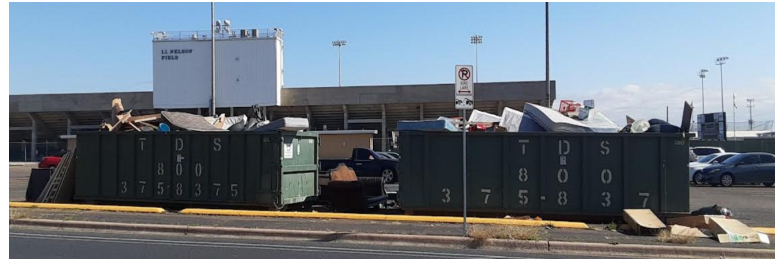
*This form has been updated – do not use a form from a previous year to request a ballot by mail.*

Be sure to:

- Fill out the ID section of the form
- Be sure to use the same ID number you used when you registered to vote. If you are not certain which number to use, you can provide both your drivers license/ state ID number AND the last four digits of your Social Security number
- Select a party primary if you want to vote in a primary election
- Include your contact information

**Applications for ballot-by-mail must be received by the county elections division no later than February 18, 2022.**

## Security Camera Considerations
