## Try This At Home.....

## Summer Activity

### Bubble Art

#### Materials:

Small plastic containers to hold the paint mixture

- tempera paint in a variety of colors
- liquid dish soap
- water
- straws
- a push pin
- small pieces of thick paper (construction, card stock, water color paper)

#### Directions:

Poke a hole into the straws so that kids can't drink the paint/bubble solution. The hole will still allow them to blow bubbles, but it will be much more difficult for kids to suck up the solution. To make my paint solution, I added paint to the bottom of a plastic container. I then added a squirt of dish soap and filled the container with a couple inches of water. You might have to play a little bit to get the best ratio of paint to water to soap.

The solution should be thin enough so that when the kids blow bubbles into the liquid, the bubbles expand over the top of the container. The kids can lightly press a small piece of paper over the bubbles. This leaves an interesting print on the paper. Add a variety of colors of bubbles to one piece of p



aper.
