A NOTE FROM PASTOR JIM

Dear Friends in Christ. As you all know, Martin Luther was an amazing person. In addition to being a pastor, professor, and theologian, he staked his very life on his faith by challenging the hierarchy of the Church. He was a prolific writer of sermons and treatises which have been collected into over 70 volumes. And if all this wasn't enough, he also wrote hymns. We are all very familiar with his *A Mighty Fortress is Our God*, but you might be surprised that he wrote over 40 hymns in total. One which comes to mind in the Christmas season is *Vom Himmel Hoch* which we know as *From Heaven Above*. His inspiration for this hymn is found in Luke 2: 8 -14 which tells of the angel appearing to the shepherds in the field. The hymn employs a rousing tune (written by Luther as well) to retell the story and Luther was not miserly with his text. What Luke reports with 7 verses, Luther expands to 14 verses! You can find the entire hymn in our hymnal #268, but I want to share with you some of those verses now.

"From heaven above to earth I come to bear good news to every home! Glad tidings of great joy I bring to all the world and gladly sing. To you this night is born a child of Mary chosen virgin mild; this new-born child of lowly birth shall be the joy of all the earth. This is the Christ, God's Son most high, who hears your sad and bitter cry, who will himself your Savior be and from all sin will set you free.

I want to point out a few things here. First of all, how personal this message is meant to be---not to only those shepherds, but to you and me as well. The angel said "for unto you" and Luther wants us to understand how personal this is by saying that this good news is brought to "every home". Also, while the angel's message focusses only on the birth, Luther expands on the greater meaning involved here. It's not just this miraculous birth in which Jesus comes to us as a child: keeping his divine nature and adding to it human nature. There's more. He comes with a purpose: to hear our sad and bitter cry and to be our Savior who will set us free from our sins.

Luther also wants us to understand that this gift of God in Jesus is not only a gift for all people---it is a gift for each individual person who will receive Jesus---each person---each one of us. *Ah dearest Jesus*, *holy child*, *prepare a bed, soft, undefiled, a quiet chamber in my heart, that you and I may never part*.

To have Jesus residing in our hearts is meant to be a very calming image, but notice that out of that calm comes exaltation. My heart for very joy now leaps; my voice no longer silence keeps; I too must sing with joyful tongue the sweetest ancient cradle song. Glory to God in the highest heaven, who unto us the Son has given. With angels sing in pious mirth a glad new year to all the earth!

May we all feel that combination of calm , peace and joy of the Christmas season with us throughout 2022 and beyond.. Vom Himmel Hoch!
