offer a musical tribute to their beloved guru.




SUDAKSHINA ALAGIA

Originally commuting from Arizona for her lessons with Lakshmiji, Sudakshina later moved to Southern California to be near her guru. Sudakshina has performed alongside as well as in the presence of acclaimed artists including Ravi Shankar, Ali Akbar Khan, Ajoy Chakrabarty among others. She has released both classical and semi-classical albums in India. In 2011, Sudakshina founded the Academy of Indian Music in San Diego which brings Hindusthani classical music to the Southern California community where she teaches and performs.



DAYITA DATTA

As a recipient of a Music Apprentice scholarship from ACTA (Alliance for California Traditional Arts), Dayita received extensive learning sessions from Lakshmiji. Dayita is a regular performer in concerts locally; vocalist for numerous Shakti Group productions directed by Viji Prakash, internationally acclaimed dancer, choreographer, and teacher of *Bharata Natyam*; lead vocalist for a dance drama featuring eminent dancer Mythili Prakash, at Vancouver, and Los Angeles; and lead vocalist in a collaboration with Quartetto Fantastico at Grand Performances, Los Angeles.



ASHWIN RODE

Ashwin Rode has over two decades of involvement in Hindustani vocal music. Vidushi Lakshmi Shankar accepted him as a student in 2009, and he regularly took lessons from her until her demise. In 2010, Lakshmiji and Ashwin were selected by the Alliance for California Traditional Arts to receive funding under the master-apprentice program. In recent years, Ashwin has performed solo concerts in the United States and India and was the supporting vocalist at Lakshmiji's 2011 concert in San Diego. Professionally, Ashwin is a Ph.D. candidate in economics at UC Santa Barbara.
