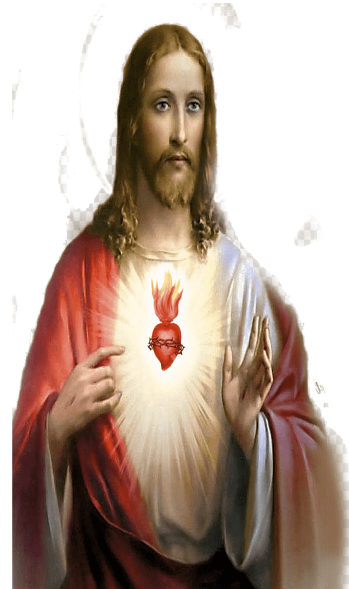
In the Second Reading 2Cor 5:6-10 Paul maintains Faith as the driving force and way of discipleship to Jesus; “We walk by faith not by sight. This is what makes us courageous.”

In the Gospel Mk 4: 26-34 Jesus teaches in the two parables about the kingdom of God. Jesus maintains that Faith in God is the way to go and enable the grace of God to work in our midst and building up his kingdom. God is at work and in control of the growth of the kingdom.

In comparing the kingdom of God to a mustard seed – which appears to be very tiny, the kingdom Jesus promulgated appeared to be very small and insignificant with only 12 Apostles and few women disciples. This kingdom with its humble beginnings professes Jesus as Savior and a sanctuary for freedom from sin.
