## **ELECTION ORDINANCE**

## **ORDINANCE NUMBER 57.1**

An ordinance to provide for biennial Village elections in September of odd-numbered years; to provide staggered four-year terms of office for Village officials; and to provide for the extension of certain terms of office in order to achieve the staggering of terms pursuant to M.C.L. 62.1.

## THE VILLAGE OF DRYDEN ORDAINS:

- Section 1. <u>Biennial September Elections</u>. Commencing with the Village election in 2007, all elections for Village offices shall be held in September of odd-numbered years.
- Section 2. <u>President Term of Office</u>. The term of office for the Village President shall be four years.
- Section 3. <u>Trustee Terms of Office</u>. The regular terms of office of the six Village Trustees shall be four years and shall be staggered.
- Section 4. Extension of Terms of Office. In order to comply with the change in election dates mandated by state statute, the current terms of office of Village officials are extended as follows:
- a. The terms of office of the three Village Trustees elected in 2002 are extended to October 1, 2007.
- b. The terms of office of the three Village Trustees elected in 2004 are extended to October 1, 2009.
- C. The term of office of the Village President elected in 2004 is hereby extended to October 1, 2007.

The undersigned Clerk of the Village of Dryden hereby certifies that this ordinance was duly
adopted by the Dryden Village Council at a meeting held on the day of day of
