

The regular meeting of the Sherman Township Board was held on July 3rd , 2017 at 7:00pm at the township hall. Meeting called to order by Supervisor. After the pledge of allegiance, roll call taken: members present: D Berens, K Berens, Miller, Stocking. Absent: K Smalligan . There was a motion by Stocking, 2nd by K Berens to approve the agenda as presented. All yes, agenda approved.

There was a motion by K Berens, 2nd by D Berens, to approve the minutes of the June 5th, 2017 regular meeting and the June 13th, 2017 special meeting. All yes, minutes of both meeting approved.

Under public comment, there was much discussion about the riparian rights on the north side of Crystal Lake and the posting of speed limit signs. Helene and Sue Knuver asked about the 10MPH signs posted and cones put out. Supervisor Miller said no one gave permission to put the signs out and that it is a county road. There were complaints from Levi Thompson and Francis Hincks about people parking cars and boat trailers on the private road that goes to their homes just south of 24th street. They said that often the road is blocked and they can not get out or in. There was a question raised that if someone gets hurt on the county road commission property, who is responsible, the county or the riparian rights holder? Miller said that the riparian rights owners may use the property for docking a boat etc but do not own it. Clerk presented a letter from Ed Taube about problems with signs posted on the public property. Miller to contact the road commission to see if a representative could attend the next township meeting.

Berens gave the treasurer's report including bills to be paid. she said that a bill from Digital Core had been received for the anti-virus and asked about paying it. There was motion by Stocking, 2nd by D Berens to accept the report and approve the bills including Digital Core. Roll call vote; YES: D Berens, K Berens, Miller, Stocking. NO, none. Absent: K Smalligan. Motion passed.

Clerk presented a PA 116 application from Nate and William Stroven at 4233 S Croswell. There was a motion by K Berens, 2nd by D Berens to approve the application for a 10 year term. Vote taken, all yes, application approved.

Miller reported that he approved a fireworks permit for Camp Echo. He said that property on Pierce Drive would be on the tax sale in August.

Trustees had nothing to report at this time.

K Berens said she had received \$175.00 for fire runs and billed \$5,510.00

Doug Berens said that the planning/zoning commission had received an application for a home business on Croswell. The commission is also working on a job description for the zoning administrator.

The building inspector gave his report. He had written 7 permits and done 5 inspections.

As Chad Kukal was not at the meeting, clerk handed out the zoning administrator's report. Butch Deur informed the board that the trailers at Long Lake that were on the dilapidated building list had been removed.

D Chenard said that officers were elected at the sewer authority meeting.

Stroven said he got verbal approval after meeting with the state on the AMAR. He also said that there was a glitch in the BS&A software that had been resolved.

DeVisser said that the John Deere tractor had been delivered.

The White Cloud fire department is still working on getting a light at M-37 and are getting specs for a new truck to go out for bids. There was nothing to report from Fremont Fire dept.

There was no public comment at this time.

Under board member comment, Karen Berens thanked everyone for coming to the meeting. Roman Miller said he would meet with those who had complaints about Crystal Lake after the meeting and go over the maps showing the road etc. Stocking said that Kukal had a new computer.
