


"Jesus Notices You" By Pastor Lee

Large crowds often followed Jesus. People were drawn to him. Whether it was because he forgave sinners, healed the sick, fed the

multitudes, or taught with authority; Jesus often was surrounded by people. One day, in the midst of a large crowd, a leper knelt before Jesus and said, "Lord, if you are willing, you can make me clean." Jesus said, "I am willing; be made clean." And he healed the man.

I think there were two miracles that day. The obvious one was the physical healing. But the other one is that in the midst of a large crowd, Jesus noticed this one man. We all want to be noticed. We all want to be known. But we are only one person among a great multitude. We can wonder if the Lord notices us, up close and personal. He does! - 1/4 cup maple syrup
- 1 tsp. pumpkin pie spice
- 1/8 tsp. salt
- 2/3 cup pecan pieces
- 1/3 cup roasted pumpkin
- seeds • 1/3 cup almonds
- 1/3 cup almond
 1/4 cup raisins
- 2/3 cup dried fruit (any)

What you do:


- Microwave syrup, spices, seeds and nuts for 30 seconds at a time, stirring frequently, until mixture thickens.
- Spread the mixture on a baking sheet lined with wax paper. Let cool and harden.
- Break the candied nuts into chunks. Combine with dried fruit.

Last winter we experienced some issues with our heating system which provides the heat to our sanctuary. Those problems were caused by a boiler that is 40+ years old. The company who maintains that system did a superb job keeping us warm for church services and other events held in our sanctuary.



For us to continue using the sanctuary without interruptions (due to lack of or insufficient heat which causes us to request that you wear winter coats or hand out extra quilts for services) the Trustees voted to replace the 40+ year old boiler prior to cold weather this year.

The new system is anticipated to be much more efficient and carries a multiyear warranty. Several bids for the new system were received. After much discussion the Trustees decided on a system with a final cost of \$13,400.00

We applied for a grant for 1/2 of the cost of the system from the district and they, after much deliberation, awarded us \$3500.00 toward the cost leaving us with a balance of \$9900.00 for the church to pay.

At this time, Trustees are asking the congregation to assist us with the remaining \$9900.00. Any amount you wish to donate or pledge to pay over the next 18 months toward that remainder would greatly assist us with that critical improvement to our church building.




Sunday, November 3th






