

## WORSHIP AND PRAYER

#### **Stewardship**

I am struck by how Jesus addresses the disciples in the 21st chapter of John. They have been fishing all night, and when the dawn comes, Jesus asks, "Children, have you caught anything to eat?" They hadn't caught a thing, so he tells them what to do to finally fill their nets. Like a child who needs a parent, these early followers of Jesus were learning that real maturity of faith requires trusting in and listening to the Teacher. The stewardship way of life demands of us a certain maturity of discipleship. Just as a child is not yet ready to be a parent, an immature disciple may not yet be ready to sacrifice regardless of the cost or understand the true value of his generosity. So every day, we are challenged and called to respond. But each step, no matter how small, brings with it growth. We are growing not only in maturity, but in the ability to trust in God and how to listen for the call as well. How mature are you in your faith? The night is now over, and the dawn is upon you. Reflect on the visible fruit of your stewardship, and then listen for the words of Jesus.

## SERVICE IN OUR PARISH

#### **Music Ministry**

As our students make their First Holy Communion this Sunday, it is fitting to talk about the beautiful songs in the Catholic tradition that speak of this most Holy Sacrament. The two things that most distinguish Catholic music from the music of other denominations are the hymns honoring our Blessed Mother and hymns of praise and adoration to Christ in the Eucharist. The texts of many of the traditional Eucharistic hymns that we still sing today were written by St. Thomas Aguinas such as "Down in Adoration Falling" or "O Saving Victim". The words of these hymns are beautiful and they have been set to music by different composers throughout the centuries. It is good for us to remember that even the outdated songs can still move our hearts to prayer in a new way and even the oldest song was once new. Also, today the Holy Spirit continues to inspire new hymns of praise to Christ in the Eucharist, and it is good as the Psalms say to, 'Sing a new song to the Lord!'. The word Eucharist means 'thanksgiving', so whether the song that we sing is old or new, the important thing is that we truly lift our hearts in thanksgiving to God for this great gift.
