PROJECT INFORMATION: Use your favorite yardage, fat quarters or 10" fabric squares to piece these sweet patchwork pineapples. The pattern includes instructions for 3 quilt sizes and a 20" by 20" quilted pillow cover. (Baby Quilt-35" by 43", Lap Quilt-61" by 69", Picnic Quilt-74" by 82".)

SUPPLIES

Please obtain all supplies prior to class.

PATTERN: **Pineapple Farm**, Patterns by Elizabeth Hartman. EH030  
Each student is required to obtain an original pattern.

GENERAL SEWING SUPPLIES:

Sewing machine, needles, pedal, and power cord, thread to match fabrics and bobbins  
Cutting mat, ruler, rotary cutter with sharp blade - a cutting station will be set up in the classroom

Pressing mat and iron - A pressing station will be set up in the classroom

Pins, shears, scissors, seam ripper

Extension Cord and/or power strip-you just can't be sure what you will need

Fan-just in case it's hot

FABRIC:

See pattern for fabric requirements based on the size project chosen. Each pineapple body is made up of 3 fabrics that are cohesive together with some contrast, and one leaf fabric. The background fabric remains the same for all pineapples.

I highly recommend you cut your fabrics prior to class. I suggest labeling all the lettered parts. Post it notes and zip loc bags are my best friends for this step. It is also helpful to have a small tray to arrange pieces of fabric while working.

## MATERIALS

	<b>Pillow*** 20" x 20" (3 blocks)</b>	<b>Baby Quilt 35" x 43" (12 blocks)</b>	<b>Lap Quilt 61" x 69" (40 blocks)</b>	<b>Picnic Quilt 74" x 82" (60 blocks)</b>
<b>Background Fabric</b>	5/8 yard	1-1/2 yards	3-7/8 yards	5-3/8 yards
<b>Colorful Fabrics for Pineapple Bodies</b>	3 fat eighths (9" x 21" each)	6 fat quarters* or 18 squares 10" x 10" each	21 fat quarters* or 60 squares 10" x 10" each	30 fat quarters* or 90 squares 10" x 10" each
<b>Colorful Fabrics for Pineapple Leaves</b>	1 fat eighth (9" x 21")	2 fat quarters** (18" x 21" each) or 6 squares 10" x 10" each	7 fat quarters** (18" x 21" each) or 20 squares 10" x 10" each	10 fat quarters** (18" x 21" each) or 30 squares 10" x 10" each
<b>Backing Fabric</b>	5/8 yard	1-3/8 yards	4-3/8 yards	5 yards
<b>Binding Fabric</b>	1/8 yard	3/8 yard	5/8 yard	3/4 yard
<b>Batting</b>	23" x 23" and 23" x 30"	38" x 46"	61" x 73"	78" x 86"

Yardages are based on fabric at least 42" wide. You will also need a fabric marking tool.

\*A fat quarter (18" x 21") is the closest standard cut. Actual fabric used is 12" x 21".

\*\*A fat quarter (18" x 21") is the closest standard cut. Actual fabric used is 14" x 21".

\*\*\*You will also need 1-1/2" yards muslin for pillow lining and a 20" x 20" pillow form.

### SELECTING PINEAPPLE FABRICS

Colorful fabrics for the pineapple bodies will be sorted into groups of 3 fat quarters or 3 squares, with each group being used to make a set of blocks. The quilt will be most successful when the fabrics in each group read as a cohesive color group, but have enough contrast among them to show off your piecing (for example, a light, medium, and dark tone of the same color).

The Picnic Quilt on the cover was made using my Pond print fabric collection for Robert Kaufman Fabrics, as well as Robert Kaufman's Kona Cotton Solids and Essex Cotton/Linen Blends.
