Pastor's Message


Beloved,

Spring is in Full Effect! I know those of you who are dealing with the heightened (me included) pollen levels are quite aware that spring is here and the world around us is blooming. As I sat and reflected on last month ... more specifically Holy Week ... I must admit that I was moved this past Holy Week more than I ever have before. The Holy Spirit was present in this place. Amen? Spring is always a season of growth and regeneration. In that vein, I was thinking of a passage from the lesser-known book of Titus. We just walked with Christ during His Passion, and it reminded me of this passage ...

Titus 3:4-7 (ESV) 4 But when the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, 5 he saved us, not because of works done by us in righteousness, but according to his own mercy, by the washing of regeneration and renewal of the Holy Spirit, 6 whom he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, 7 so that being justified by his grace we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life.

In reading this, I am reminded that every aspect of our salvation as described in verses 4–7 depends on God's action; none of it depends on what we do. Even though Paul repeatedly urges Christians to prepare for and perform good works, these are the harvest of God's grace in saving us from our sins and are not prepayments or repayments for His salvation. God's love and the grace He extends to us are in keeping with His merciful nature. The washing, regeneration and renewal given us in Baptism brings new life and spiritual cleansing. God provides this Baptism as a means for us to receive His grace.

So, as the temperatures are warming, I pray that our hearts follow suit. Use this warmer weather to regenerate our bodies and our minds. We must never lose sight that He is there, He is comforting us, and He is leading us ... I pray we are open to where He wants us to Go. Amen?

Workday at the Church Saturday April 9, 2022

I would like to thank everyone who helped make the workday a hug success. A special thanks to Wayne Latimer and family for replacing all the fluorescent lights in the sanctuary with LED lights. This enhances the lighting quality and is a cost saving on our energy bills.

Future projects:

 \cdot Both doors to the pastor's office need work. The inside door, frame and trim needs to be replaced. The outside door and adjacent wall need to be rebuilt in order to make it weather tight and secure. New Doors are on order will be delivered around July 15, 2022.

 \cdot We need to address repairs to our parking lot. Both entrances need to be repaved and several areas are breaking up. We also need to seal coat some areas and stripe the parking spaces. This has a price tag of about \$25,000 to \$30,000 which we may have to address in phases. If we don't address these areas soon, the water will get to the underside of the pavement causing potholes. This will increase the cost of repairs. This item will be discussed at the upcoming Voters Meeting on May 15,2022.

 \cdot The Elders have requested that the Sacristy Room be renovated to meet the current needs of this space. This will be considered once the door project is complete and we have direction on the parking lot repairs.
