# **Hunger Facts**

- Food security is "access by all people at all times to enough food for an active, healthy life." Food insecurity means that consistent access to adequate food is limited by a lack of money and other resources at times during the year.
- One in 10 Minnesotans, or more than 500,000 state residents are food insecure on a regular basis. That is more people than attended Minnesota Vikings home games during the 2015 regular season.
- 8.3% of seniors in Minnesota reported being threatened by hunger. Senior hunger is expected to rise as more baby boomers reach age 60.
- Lack of adequate nutrition can impair a child's ability to concentrate at school.
- Children who experience hunger get sick more often, recover from illness slower and are hospitalized more frequently than children who do not. Children who experience hunger are more likely to experience headaches, stomachaches, colds, ear infections and fatigue.



On the weekends of November 11/12 & 18/19 our giving trees will be set up in the link with gift requests from families at College Prep Elementary and Holy Rosary Church. We will have a variety of gift requests at a variety of prices and we welcome you to take more than one tag if you desire. Children ages 18 and under will have two tags on the tree; one for their clothing request and the other for a toy or gift card request (you are not obligated to select both tags).

Donations of wrapping paper, gift bags, tags, and tape are appreciated as well. If you prefer to make a monetary donation, we can use it to purchase extra gifts and wrapping paper (checks payable to St. Cecilia Church with a notation of "Giving Tree").

We hope you'll consider participating in this outreach program to benefit families who would otherwise go without gifts at Christmas.

Gifts are returned to the link (unwrapped w/the gift tag fastened) by December 3rd.
