A NOTE FROM PASTOR JIM

"Behold, I am with you always, to the end of the ages."

Dear Friends in Christ,

As I write this at the end of August, the days have been relatively cool---in the mid to high 70's and the nights have been very pleasant. Some mornings have been in the 50's. All of this points to a new season coming. We certainly will have more hot and humid days, but it is nice to have a reminder that more pleasant weather will arrive soon. The seasons will change.

Yes, the seasons change. We will be moving into the fourth season with this Corona virus. It began in the winter. By March it had the world in its grip. We even were told we had to close the churches! Who would have thought that we would not be together for Holy Week and Easter? Thankfully, by June we were allowed to gather together again. June. We are people of prayer. Let us remember that in the darkest of dark times, when all seemed lost because Jesus died hanging on a cross, all was not lost. The women who went to the tomb found it empty. An angel was there telling them that Jesus had risen from the dead, just as He had told them. Matthew tells us that "they departed quickly from the tomb with fear and great joy, and ran to tell the disciples. And behold, Jesus met them and said, 'Greetings!' And they came up and took hold of his feet and worshipped him. Then Jesus said to them, 'Do not be afraid; go and tell my brothers to go to Galilee, and there they will see me'." When the disciples went to Galilee, they did see Jesus. This is what He told them. "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you.
