

OPENING HYMN 538

"The Church's One Foundation"

Please stand before the 4th verse

M: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you.

C: And also with you.

M: Today, as we celebrate 150 years of God's grace to our Salem-Lowell campus, it is good for us to be reminded how our history continues a story that has been unfolding since the beginning of time. Our struggles of the past and the present remind us that Satan is a real enemy, who fights against the work of our God today - just as he has fought against it since the creation of this world. But our Almighty God has taken action to save us. Let us be reminded of our God's saving activity throughout the ages – and the victory that He now shares with us today.

It was in Eden that Satan destroyed the relationship which existed between God and the crown of his creation. It was in Eden that this tragic cry first arose from the human heart:

- C: Lord, have mercy on us. Show us your face, O Lord. Remove us from Satan's power.
- M: When the time was right, God acted. He sent his one and only Son into the world to do for his creatures what they could not do for themselves. Jesus Christ lived, died and rose again to renew the image that was lost in Eden. The Church was founded to carry the message of restoration and renewal into all the world.
- C: Glory to God in the highest, and peace to his people on earth! We shall not die but live and declare the praises of God.

- M: Satan was not finished. He challenged the Church's faith and mission with his evil influence. God preserved his Church, often quietly, sometimes with only a whisper. But even in the depths of darkness, the light of grace flickered. In the fourth century, when Satan attacked the deity of Christ, the Church confessed:
- C: We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God.
- M: In the fifth century, when the doctrine of the Trinity was attacked, the Church confessed:
- C: Now this is the true Christian faith:
 - "We worship one God in three persons and three persons in one God, without mixing the persons or dividing the divine being.

 For each person the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit is distinct, but the deity of Father, the Son, and Holy Spirit is one, equal in glory and co-eternal in majesty."
- M: Through the centuries the battle continued. Often Satan seemed to be the victor. The cry of God's people continued:
- C: Lord, have mercy on us. Show us your face, O Lord. Remove us from Satan's power.
- M: When the time was right, God acted. He raised up a man with weakness and failures. But God used that man to be a messenger of the everlasting gospel. That man was Martin Luther. We do not praise Luther, but we praise God for choosing Martin Luther to be an instrument in restoring to the Church the good news of forgiveness and salvation through Christ.
- C: We give you thanks, O Lord, for those who have gone before us. Help us to live and confess the Christian faith for your glory, for those around us and for those who will follow.
- M: Satan has not finished attacking the Church. Lord, we must confess that we have given in to his temptations. We have failed to fear and respect you as we should. Like our first parents, we have turned in rebellion from your ways. We have failed to love you with an undivided heart and mind. We have failed to love one another as you have commanded. So often, we despise your life-giving gifts of Word and Sacrament to chase after the dead things of this world. So often, we seek after our own glory instead of yours.
- C: Lord, have mercy on us. Show us your face, O Lord. Remove us from Satan's power.

Silence to reflect on our failure to live a God-pleasing life

M: Lord, we thank and praise you for not leaving us defenseless. You are our refuge and strength. You sent your Son to be pierced for our transgressions and crushed for our iniquities. Because of Christ's sacrifice in our place you promise that when we confess our sins, you are faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.



C: Lord Jesus, you are my righteousness, and I am your sin. You became what you were not - that I might become what I was not. We shall not die but live and declare the praises of God!

M: For your saving works, O Lord, we offer our thanksgiving on this special day. You are the God of faithful grace throughout the centuries – and the God who has faithfully carried us for the past 150 years.

PRAYER OF THE DAY

M: Let us pray. O God, you have promised to be with your Church forever. We thank you for those who founded this community of believers and for the signs of your favor over these past 150 years. Increase our faith, knit us together in the bonds of love, and make our fellowship an example to all people; we ask this through Jesus Christ, your Son, our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.
