Passion Reading for Week Four Mark 14:43-65 (EHV)

Jesus' Arrest and Jesus' First Trial in the Sanhedrin
P: Pastor M: Men W: Women

- P: Just then, while he was still speaking, Judas, one of the Twelve, arrived. A crowd was with him, armed with swords and clubs. They were from the chief priests, the experts in the law, and the elders. Now his betrayer had given them a signal, saying,
- M: "The one I kiss is the man. Arrest him and lead him away under guard."
- P: He went right to Jesus and said, "Rabbi!" and kissed him.
- W: They laid hands on him and arrested him. But one of those who stood nearby drew his sword, struck the servant of the high priest, and cut off his ear.
- P: Jesus responded by saying to them, "Have you come out with swords and clubs to capture me as you would a criminal? Day after day I was with you, teaching in the

temple courts, and you did not arrest me. But this happened so that the Scriptures may be fulfilled."

- M: Then the disciples all left him and fled.
- W: A certain young man was following him, wearing just a linen cloth over his naked body. They seized him, but he left behind the linen cloth and fled from them naked.
- M: They led Jesus away to the high priest. All the chief priests, the elders, and the experts in the law gathered together. Peter followed him at a distance, right into the courtyard of the high priest. He was sitting with the guards and warming himself at the fire.
- W: The chief priests and the whole Sanhedrin were looking for testimony against Jesus in order to put him to death, but they did not find any. Many testified falsely against him, but their testimonies did not agree. Some stood up and gave this false testimony against him:
- P: "We heard him say, 'I will destroy this temple made with hands, and in three days I will build another made without hands." Yet even on this point, their testimony did not agree.
- M: The high priest stepped forward and questioned Jesus, "Have you no answer? What is this they are testifying against you?"
- W: But Jesus was silent and did not answer anything.
- M: Again the high priest asked him, "Are you the Christ, the Son of the Blessed One?"
- P: "I am," Jesus said. "And you will see the Son of Man sitting at the right hand of power and coming with the clouds of heaven."

- M: The high priest tore his robes and said, "Why do we need any more witnesses? You have heard the blasphemy! What do you think?"
- W: They all condemned him as being worthy of death. Then some began to spit on him. They covered his face and struck him with their fists, saying, "Prophesy!" The guards also took him and beat him.

¹⁹ Brothers, we have confidence to enter the Most Holy Place through the blood of Jesus. ²⁰ It is a new and living way he opened for us through the curtain, that is, his flesh. ²¹ We also have a great priest over the house of God. ²² So let us approach with a sincere heart, in the full confidence of faith, because our hearts have been sprinkled to take away a bad conscience, and our bodies have been washed with pure water. ²³ Let us hold on firmly to the confession of our hope without wavering, since he who promised is faithful. ²⁴ Let us also consider carefully how to spur each other on to love and good works. ²⁵ Let us not neglect meeting together, as some have the habit of doing. Rather, let us encourage each other, and all the more as you see the Day approaching.
