A Message from Pastor Robert.....

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

As I write this it is currently -8 degrees outside, reminding me and all Wisconsinites of where we live. This also reminds me of one of my favorite quotes by a fellow Wisconsinite, "February is the longest month of the year, thank God it only last 28 days". By February most Wisconsinites are done with winter. Typically, by February the snow is old and dirty, the air hurts the face, and whatever joy people had carried over from the holiday season has worn off in the face of this cold desolate leafless wasteland. Yet this winter season it seems that winter has come late. December was warmer then normal with temperatures averaging in the 40's and it wasn't until December 31st that we had our first real snow storm. January, until recently, has also been unseasonably warm, making this winter season a little more bearable.

Yet now that winter is definitely in full swing that means many people with mobility issues are already finding it even harder to get around. In the warmer months of the year people with problems related to mobility have a hard enough time trying to get around, now compound those issues with the presence of snow and ice and the prospects of going outside can be completely terrifying. This means that people who could already be partially isolated due to their mobility issues will be even more isolated, especially if they live alone. During the winter months mobility issues could lead people into spending days, weeks, or even months alone isolated in their homes out of fear of falling and ending up in a potentially life threatening position.

One of the easiest and most rewarding things we can do during these cold icy months ahead is reach out and identify those with limited mobility in our communities and be a loving presence for them. Donate our time to help someone clear ice and snow from their walkways; accompany someone as they go on errands so they don't worry about being alone in a place where they could potentially fall; or share a meal, dessert, or just a cup of coffee with someone who is isolated. Anything that we can do to help a person feel as if they are truly a beloved child of God who is not alone, but instead cherished and loved is not only helpful but necessary in creating a sense of community amongst all people. Knowing you are loved and that your presence is a blessing is an important message for everyone, but it is especially important for those who are isolated from the world due to mobility issues or other ailments.

"Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor. Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers.

Bless those who persecute you; bless and do not curse them. Rejoice with those who rejoice, weep with those who weep. Live in harmony with one another; do not be haughty, but associate with the lowly; do not claim to be wiser than you are. Do not repay anyone evil for evil, but take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. If it is possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all."-Romans 12:9-18


