

Birthing the New @ Christmas With Pastor Eric

⁸ For nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; there will be earthquakes in various places; there will be famines. This is but the beginning of the birth pangs." - Mark 13:8

³When they say, "There is peace and security," then sudden destruction will come upon them, as labor pains come upon a pregnant woman, and there will be no escape! – 1 Thessalonians 5:3

Well at Men's Bible Study recently, someone asked in all seriousness, "What is a birth pang? Is it pain? Or maybe something else?" I mentioned this question to a new mother who glared at me and responded, "Be thankful that you will never know or experience a pang!"

Jesus talks about the end of time and the second coming as a birthing process. Besides the parallel passage in Mt 24:8, the image of "birth pangs" and the coming of Jesus is used by Paul in 1 Thess 5:3. He emphasizes the surprise and suddenness of the coming. When our children were conceived, we knew that labor pains would be coming and a birth to follow. We didn't know exactly when it would happen or how long the labor would last, or how we would cope with that suffering -- and the new creation it produced. We knew it was coming. We waited expectedly and excitedly for it. We also had some fear and trembling wondering what kind of parents we would be. The scriptures promise that there will be an end to suffering but the labor has been long! In fact, we begin to imagine life differently while pregnant, don't we? We begin nesting – rearranging rooms, buying a different car, trying out names like mom and dad, and many times changing locations

for better schools or younger neighborhoods. With new beginnings with hope and promise comes the endings of other things, and those ending mean gone but probably not forgotten.

The Christmas story is simply a "birthing narrative" centered on an actual birth and the beginnings and endings that come with it. Anyone with children or were children © can identify with the new thing that God has done in Jesus our Christ. And yes, there was pain and suffering, pangs, involved along the way – Mary pregnant before the proper time of marriage, Elizabeth pregnant well into her later years, no place in the inn, Mary traveling on a donkey 65 miles to Bethlehem at 9 months, Herod is out to slaughter children in Bethlehem, and the holy family having to flee for their lives to another country. We cannot forget these parts of this story as labor pains which will lead to something new!

Remember that Jesus's world existed without medications and well before modern medicine. Mothers and babies died quite often in the process and many children were blessed to live past 3 years old. Every birth was a life-altering event in every way possible — a true miracle and then Jesus came! Jesus will come again in a similar way with "birth pangs" preceding him, but don't be afraid because God has control just as God did the first time. God might be birthing something or someone in your life this season. Everything will be alright. Do not be afraid! Nothing is impossible for God — not a virgin birth and not resurrection from the dead!

Let us pray. Gracious God, breathe life into our holiday time amidst the hectic schedules and celebrations, give us deep joy and hope in the new creation that you birth into being. May we remember our new birth by baptism and our renewed life by your Spirit this miracle season, in Jesus' name we pray. Amen.





I recently checked out A Shepherd Looks at Psalm 23 by W. Phillip Keller from the church library to use as a morning devotional. The description (As a shepherd, Phillip Keller shares his insights into the life and character of sheep and of the Good Shepherd who loves and cares for them...) intrigued me. While I don't have experience raising sheep in particular, I have cared for a wide variety of other animals over the years, and it never ceases to amaze me how lessons learned from raising animals can relate to God's Word. That and the idea of God as a loving, caring shepherd has always resonated with me, so I decided to see what this book was all about.

I found it to be an easy read, with short chapters breaking down the Psalm verse by verse. The author draws on his own experiences of raising and working with sheep, as well as providing insight into what the original author of the Psalm (David, also a shepherd) may have truly been trying to articulate. While it was originally published in 1970, I found to still be greatly relevant and relatable to present day, and was pleasantly surprised by the fresh insight I learned about this iconic piece of scripture. I highly recommend giving it a try if you're looking for an uplifting, easy read this winter. You may even find yourself singing, "I just wanna be a sheep, bah, ba-ba, bah", like I did!


