The County approached the Village regarding this parcel and said that it had been bid on at the auction, however the successful bidder did not finalize the sale and ended up forfeiting his down payment. At this point he is interested in finalizing the purchase. Since the parcel is Village owned it is up to the Village to decide whether or not to privately sell the parcel.

Attorney Silver explained to the Board they would have to establish a value. If they are interested they may want to ask Mr. Patel if he is willing to pay for an appraiser and move forward in that manner.
