

# "....There's nothing we can't achieve"

Last week I was privileged to join my mother at a meeting of her local section of the National Council of Jewish Women, an organization she has supported (and at times led) for most of my life. NCJW's mission is social justice, particularly on topics that affect women (what doesn't?) The speaker at last week's meeting [December 14] was Takeata King-Pang of the Women's Foundation of Florida, and I would like to share with you what she told us during her inspiring presentation on how to advocate to your elected officials for the causes that are meaningful to you.

There are a number of ways to contact your state and national officials, including phone calls, emails, and letters. Takeata noted that snail mail gets more attention than email, and it always helps to personalize your communication ("Tell your story" she urged, over and over again.) In-person visits also make a strong impression; she recommends meeting with legislators in their (your) home district rather than in the capitol during a legislative session, as they will have more time to talk to you. Going to government meetings and special events is also a powerful way to connect; she recommends getting on your legislators' email lists so that you can find out when events are taking place.

When contacting your representatives, she says, be honest and open and tell your story. Ideally, bring a "leave behind" with information and resources; these documents will get filed and retained, and strengthen your case. As a former legislative staffer, she stressed the importance of working with the staff, who can raise the profile of issues with the official. Tell your legislators when you agree as well as disagree with their stance on an issue, so that they know what their constituents are thinking. Legislators will pay more attention to those who live in their district; the standard script is to say, "My name is .... and I live in zip code ..... Here's what I want Senator/Representative ... to know."

Takeata noted that direct contact with officials is more effective than marches and rallies (with the exception of this year's Women's March, which she called hugely successful at affecting legislators' thinking); group contact (say, from an organization or coalition of organizations) is also very effective.

Takeata's words were clearly inspiring to all those in attendance at this meeting. However, Takeata didn't leave it at that. She passed out a piece of paper with the phone numbers of several of the state legislators for the areas around the meeting place, and asked everyone to get out her phone and make a call then and there to express support for one of the upcoming bills that had previously been discussed at the meeting.

AND IT WORKED! Before the meeting was over, one Florida state senator's office had contacted Takeata to assure her that the senator would indeed support that bill.

If you find it half as inspiring as I did, and take action as the women in that room did, there's nothing we can't achieve.

#### **ADVOCACY IN ACTION: MEETING WITH LAWMAKERS**

NCJW-SE Atlantic had an opportunity to meet with several local lawmakers on December 13 at a Legislative Send-Off held by the Jewish Community Relations Committee of South Palm Beach County (JCRC). The purpose of the meeting was to highlight the work and financial needs of local Jewish Federation agencies. Several moving videos of Federation programs that help seniors, the disabled, and Holocaust survivors were shown. The meeting was also an opportunity for NCJW-SEA members Diane Kessler (Section rep to the JCRC) and Lillian Kaminer (Section VP for Advocacy) to promote several advocacy positions in advance of this term's State legislative session. In attendance were State Senator Kevin Rader, State Representatives Lori Berman and Emily Slosberg, as well as representatives of State Senator Bill Hager and US Representative Ted Deutsch. All were given information about NCJW and our position on pending legislation. At the State level, NCJW has taken a stand on the following:

Support SB 96, which would require schools to include information about human trafficking in health classes

Vote No on HB 41 and SB 444, which would extend Crisis Pregnancy Clinics (which are antiabortion facilities more than legitimate health care agencies)

Support HB 588 and HB 211, which expand Florida Hate Crimes definitions

Support HB 191, which protects the affordable housing trust fund.

All members are encouraged to contact their representatives about these bills.

# Computer Printing Tip:


Have you ever wanted to print out only one page of a bulletin? Here's how it works on a PC:


At the top of the screen, <u>do not</u> dick on the printer picture. Instead click on the word FILE, then click on PRINT.
