Presidents Message

Fellow compatriots,



The snow shoveling season is now behind us and spring has sprung! The year 2023 has already started out as another year of change. On February 2nd, the Colorado River Chapter was approved by the State Board of Managers to merge with the Prescott Chapter. The Prescott Chapter now covers the Arizona counties of Coconino, La Paz, Yavapai and Yuma. One member of the deactivated Rim Country Chapter transferred into the Prescott Chapter which brought our total membership to 74.

Over the past two years I have been continuously amazed by our board and committee members. Due to their dedication, generosity, commitment and extraordinary efforts our chapter continues to set high standards and goals. Thanks to Paul Kerper we have awarded so far this year eight Flag Certificates to homeowners for appropriately flying the U.S. flag. Since January four Certificates of Appreciation have been awarded to non-members for helping the chapter during last years rodeo fund raiser. In addition, Alan Fitch, Paul Kerper and Hal Reniger, reviewed 30 middle school brochures from the fifth, seventh and eighth grades for the Canyon Ridge School Brochure Contest. The top three winners picked will receive from our chapter \$100 for first place; \$75 for second place and \$50 for third place. The awards will be presented in Surprise during a Social Studies Awards Assembly at the school on May 9th. Hal Reniger is also working with five local Boy Scout troops to recognize all Eagle Scouts retroactive to 2020. ROTC committee members Dick Melick and Bill Oden have been actively involved with awarding ROTC/JROTC medals and certificates. Bill is responsible for Flagstaff and Northern Arizona, while Dick handles locally.

Another example of our chapter leading by action is our desire to commemorate the 250th anniversary of the United States Declaration of Independence in 2026. Our chapter has reached out to the local DAR chapters about how best to celebrate this important milestone. As a result, a combined SAR/DAR committee is being formed. More information will be forth coming as plans develop for this once in a generation event.

Thanks to the leadership of Color Guard Captain Steve Monez, our Color Guard has continued to serve as a proud tradition over the years by offering service to civic, community, and non-profit organizations along with representing our chapter at historic and patriotic events. This spring the Color Guard starting posting the Colors at the Wrangler football games held in the Findlay Toyota Center at Prescott Valley. For only the second time in our chapter's history, our Color Guard was chosen to lead the annual 4th of July Prescott Frontier Days rodeo parade on July 1st.

Speaking of the rodeo, for the third straight year, chapter members along with their family and friends have volunteered to work the last rodeo event on July 4th as part of our chapter's funding raising. If you are interested in helping please contact a board member.

Sadly, founding charter member and Past President James Wadsworth "Jim" Trowbridge passed away on December 23, 2022. His passing leaves only one known living charter member, Past President Bob Wixon. He is currently a dual member of the Prescott and Saguaro Chapters.

Congratulations to former Board Secretary Bill Smith. He won the "Call to Arms" bronze Minuteman statute created and donated by Past Prescott Chapter President Dennis DeAtley. Thank you Dennis for you generous donation.

In closing, I would like to thank everyone for their continued support and participation as the Prescott Chapter moves forward towards another eventful year.

America



250th Anniversary

The 250th Anniversary is a celebration of our fight for Independence from the end of the French and Indian War in 1763 to the Final Treaty of Paris on September 3, 1783. This is highlighted by the Declaration of Independence in 1776.

As members of the Sons of the American Revolution it is our responsibility to tell the stories about those times our patriots fought to gain freedom form British control over the 13 colonies, later called the United States of America.

This link takes you to a valuable tool that will help you set up your events and programs. Share these events with your chapter, DAR, Service Clubs, and the community. Share our story with as many groups as you can https://america250sar.org/static/75c32156ec6f9e02ed1a7c913743f264/america-250-sarprogramtoolkitmar-23-22.pdf?dl=1. This tool kit has a road map for our members to get the message to the people who may have never heard the story of our beginning. There are many ways you can participate. The color guard can participate, members can use the Patriot Chest with children in the schools. Members can dress in uniform if possible.

Schedule events in the community and invite all that would like to take part. Send out announcements in the newspaper. Make your event special. Hold it at a special venue.

The Declaration of Independence and Constitution can be given to each person. Make a handout that the community can take with them. You can pick a patriot and tell their story.

The National organization has examples of forms, letterhead, news releases, cards, and certificates to help each chapter.

Awards are based on activity and the awarding of points for each type of activity:

- a. Directing, chairing, or co-chairing an event or sub-committee for the duration of the event. (20 points)
- b. Participation in the planning, financing, promotion or conduct of an event other than directing, chairing, or co chairing.
- an event. Those that do direct, chair or co-chair and event and also serve as a regular member of a committee or sub-committee in a non-leadership role, may also earn points. (10 points)
- c. Attending an Event (3 points)
- d. Attending an event in Colonial Attire (5 points)
- d. Attending an event in Colonial Attire (5 points)

SAR Members may be awarded the Medals for achieving the following levels:

- a. Bronze Medal: 25 promotion points as certified by his chapter, state, district, or national society.
- b. Silver Medal: Compatriots who earn 60 promotion points as certified by his chapter, state, district or national

society.

c. Gold Medal: Compatriots who earn 150 promotion points as certified by his chapter, state, district, and national society. They will receive a letter authorized by Gary Gift Chairman 250th Gold Medal Committee to purchase the medal.

Recognition







Bucky O'Neill Spanish American War, Borglum Bronze on the Court House Plaza

This is an inspiring statue of Bucky O'Neill in front of the Prescott, Arizona, courthouse in Courthouse Square. Bucky O'Neill (February 2, 1860-July 1,1898) was an editor, sheriff, and many other jobs in Prescott, Arizona. He was also a Captain in Roosevelt's Rough Riders. His name came because he tended to "buck the finger" or play against the odds in games of gambling. He was killed in Cuba. The statue was made by Solon Burglum who was America's first cowboy sculptor (1868-1922). The statue was dedicated July 3, 1907. It is a beautiful statue and please take time to read the plaques on it and to just observe it from all angles-do not just look at it and pass it by. It is especially nice at Christmas when the square is all lit up.

It is on top of a large boulder that weighs 28 tons according to one website. There are several plaques around it. One is a long roster of those who served in the Rough Riders. Another honors the sculptor. Another honors Bucky O'Neill and the Rough Riders. Another is a bas relief image of the Rough Riders in battle. According to the Smithsonian record, it depicts Teddy Roosevelt astride his horse in battle. The final one is a list of the commissioners at the time the statue was created and unveiled.


