

POSSIBLE FREESTYLE CLINIC

In last year's membership survey, the two most requested clinics were the "Ride a Review" and "Freestyle" clinics. A "Ride a Review" or "Test and Re-Test" Clinic has been scheduled for February 28th. We will discuss the possibility of having a Freestyle clinic at the Awards Banquet. Freestyle Clinic for both Traditional and Western Dressage

These clinics are fun and educational! Cynthia will find a musical score that matches your horses' stride and movement. EVEN LOWER LEVELS CAN PARTICIPATE!

Note: We will need a lot of member support in order to hold this clinic. There is a 5 rider minimum and we will need a partial payment up front as well as an auditor fee in order to cover the costs.

What to Expect:

- You will see first-hand how the appropriate music can enhance the horse's gaits
- Music can help riders to regulate a consistent tempo which can lead to relaxation, the basis of the training scale

CLINIC Format:

- 1) A 2 hour Lecture and video presentation covering USEF rules and USDF/FEI requirements is usually held the evening before the clinic. Questions can be answered at any time during the presentation. The video portion shows freestyles Cynthia has designed for herself and clients from Training level through Grand Prix. The technical and artistic aspects of the freestyles are discussed during the presentation.

TDF Awarded Over \$53,000 to Dressage Groups in 2015 For Educational Events

Thanks to the support of many generous donors throughout the years, significant meaningful financial support has been provided to non-profit dressage organizations from The Dressage Foundation's Grant Funds.

In 2015, over \$53,000 was awarded to groups from Maine to Hawaii and Alaska to Florida. Over 1,000 individuals participated in events that included educational symposia and seminars, musical freestyle clinics, dressage camps, the USDF Instructor Certification Program, and so much more.

A member of a USDF Group Member Organization (GMO) in Virginia shared, "As an organizer for this year's adult dressage camp, I realized how crucial your grants are to us. They allow us to keep the camper fee reasonable, allowing more people to participate. Thank you so much for your support!"

Continuing Education for Dressage Instructors Fund – For nonprofit groups hosting USDF's Instructor Certification Program.

Sally Swift Fund – For nonprofit groups to organize a Centered Riding® clinic.

Edgar Hotz Judges Fund – Provides support to USDF GMOs for the "Continuing Education for Judges and L Program Graduates" program.

Michael Poulin Dressage Fund – For nonprofit groups or individuals to host an event that will improve the quality of dressage in their area through riding, training, instructing, or judging.

For many years, grants made possible by TDF donors have also supported USDF's Junior/Young Rider Clinic Series and the USEF/USDF Young Rider Graduate Program.

We had one of the highest attendances for Region 5 for the meetings and the awards dinner ever! It's always a great chance for networking, catching up with old friends and participating in the governance of our great sport. Our 2 regional meetings went very well and a lot of great information was exchanged. The weather was cooler for Las Vegas, but comfortable in the evenings with a light coat. I have to admit I definitely took advantage of the destination and did the most tourist activities at this convention then I've done in years. I enjoyed the roller coaster, wine cellars, the NASCAR parade, the Ferris wheel High Roller, the fountains at Bellagio, shopping and dinner at many great restaurants of the strip in the local part of Las Vegas. We had our own person cab driver the whole week and he was fantastic about taking us to some fun and unique spots. The hotel was pretty nice and I even spent a few dollars in the slot machines and at the Texas Hold'em table.

Some key things to come out of the convention this year:

- We will continue the \$200 reimbursement grant for those attending the USDF Convention as USDF Region 5 PM Delegates for the 2016 USDF Convention in St Louis.
- The budget was presented as balanced and was approved. The finances of USDF are looking very good and we are doing well as an organization
- PM membership is up. GMO member is down a little but overall USDF membership is doing very well.
- USDF National Championships continue to be very well received and more rave reviews this year. We were at approximately the same number of entries for 2015 as we were for 2014. Bids are soon going to be open for the management of the 2017-2019 Finals
- The USDF Board of Governors voted to keep the Finals in Kentucky for the time being and not move West until such time Region 4, 5, 6, 7 and 9 can come forward to the BOG with an adequate venue that meets the needs of the show in terms of weather, footing, stabling and several other factors.



Western Dressage News

Western Dressage is a new sport and it is in various stages of acceptance with different organizations. Because there are different Western Dressage organizations, they have different rules and tests. This can be very confusing to our new Western Dressage members, so I wanted to give you a brief explanation of how our club is affiliated and links to the rules and tests you would follow when riding in our schooling shows.

With our club, the US Equestrian Federation is at the top of the pyramid and it has many different divisions under it. Our dressage club (PDNDS) is in the "dressage division" (The United States Dressage Federation - USDF). There is also a "Western Dressage" division under USEF.



When you ride in one of the Paso Del Norte Dressage Society Schooling Shows, you are following the rules and tests that are associated with USEF.

The Western Dressage Association® of America (WDAA) is delighted to announce that, beginning with 2016, the World Championship Show will be organized and hosted under the WDAA brand. This change includes a new venue, management team, date, and show format. It was important to the WDAA Executive Board to select a facility located in the geographic center of the Western Dressage Community. The Lazy E Arena in Guthrie, OK was chosen as the host facility. With stabling for 500 horses, a park-like setting with a large pond, RV park, and indoor facilities large enough for five show arenas with

warm-up, the facility offers plenty of room to grow. The Lazy E Arena is located a few miles from Edmond, which is a college town with plenty of lodging, dining, and entertainment opportunities. The Oklahoma City Metroplex is only 25 minutes from the Lazy E and offers additional cultural and entertainment options. The show will be managed by Horse Show Consulting with Nora Wert serving as Show Manager and Stacia Wert-Gray serving as Show Secretary. The website, www.horseshowconsulting.com, will offer complete information regarding sponsorship, prize list, entry blanks, online entry, exhibitor lists, stabling charts,

spectator information, and additional features.

In order to better accommodate competitors traveling long distances, the show will be moved six weeks forward in the calendar. The specific dates are for the next 3 consecutive years are:

• September 29 - October 2, 2016

The new show format will include many exciting changes designed to enhance the competitor, spectator, and sponsor experience. Some of these changes include four days of classes, a \$1,000 freestyle stake, expanded awards including top ten ribbons for world championships, exhibitor's party and silent auction, welcome party, and much more.
