

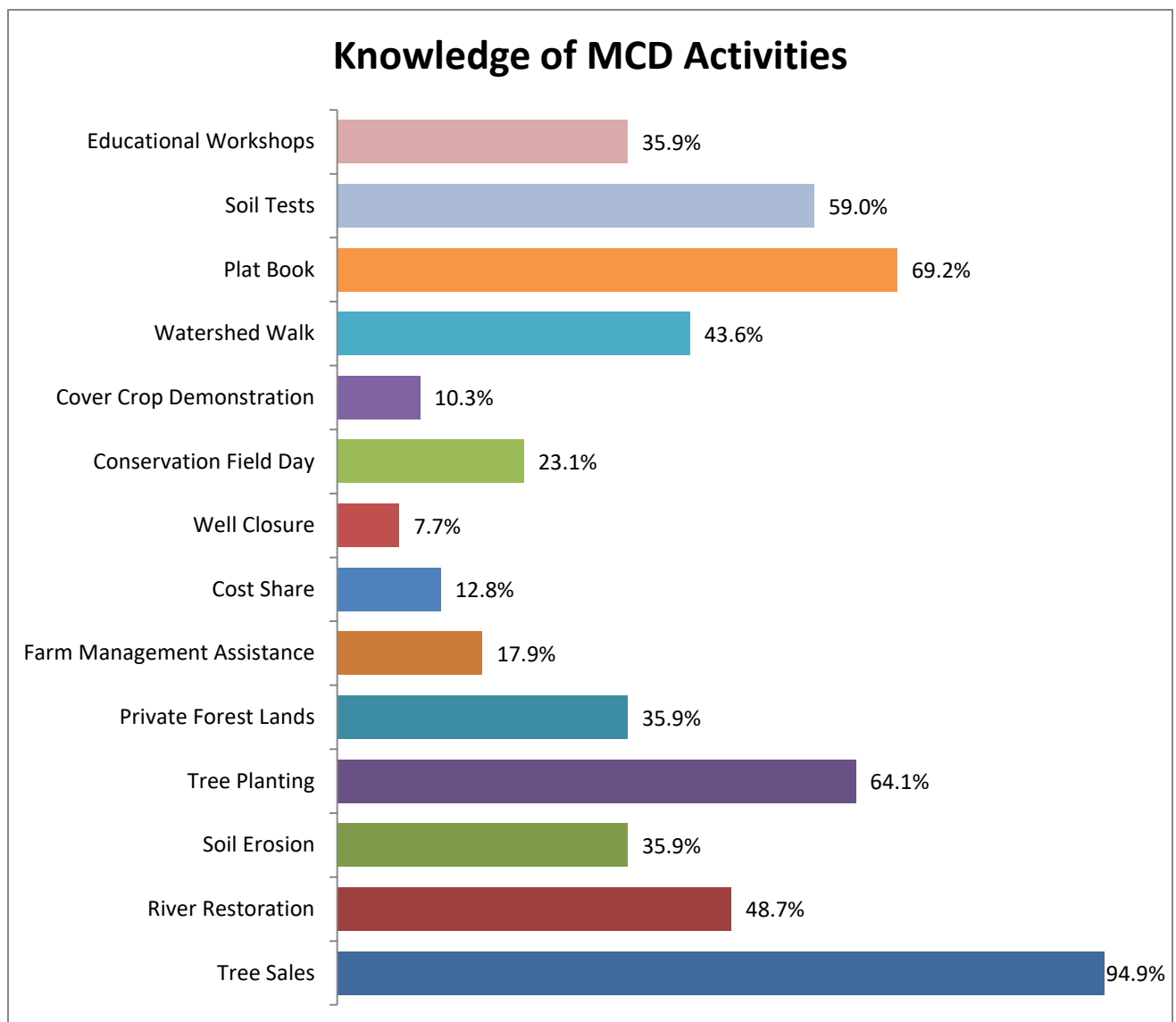
# 2016 Resource Assessment Survey Results

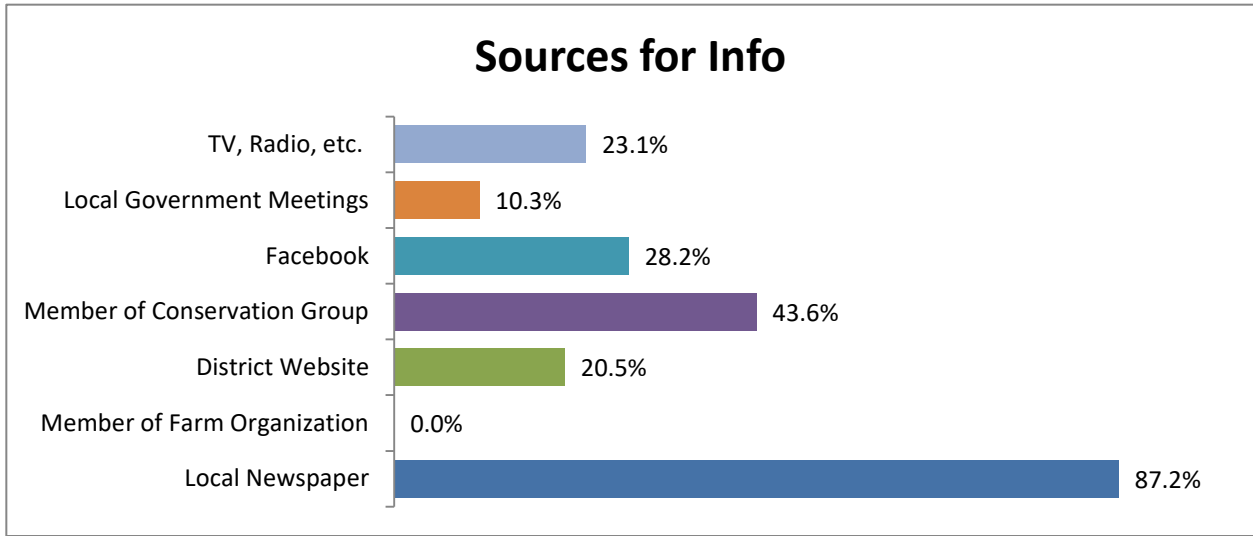

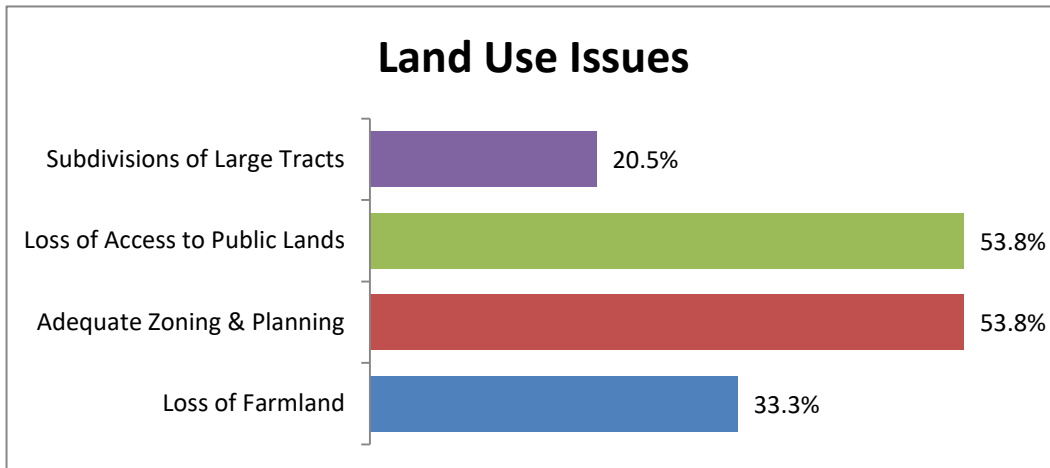
What sources do you use to keep informed about natural resource issues in Montmorency County?

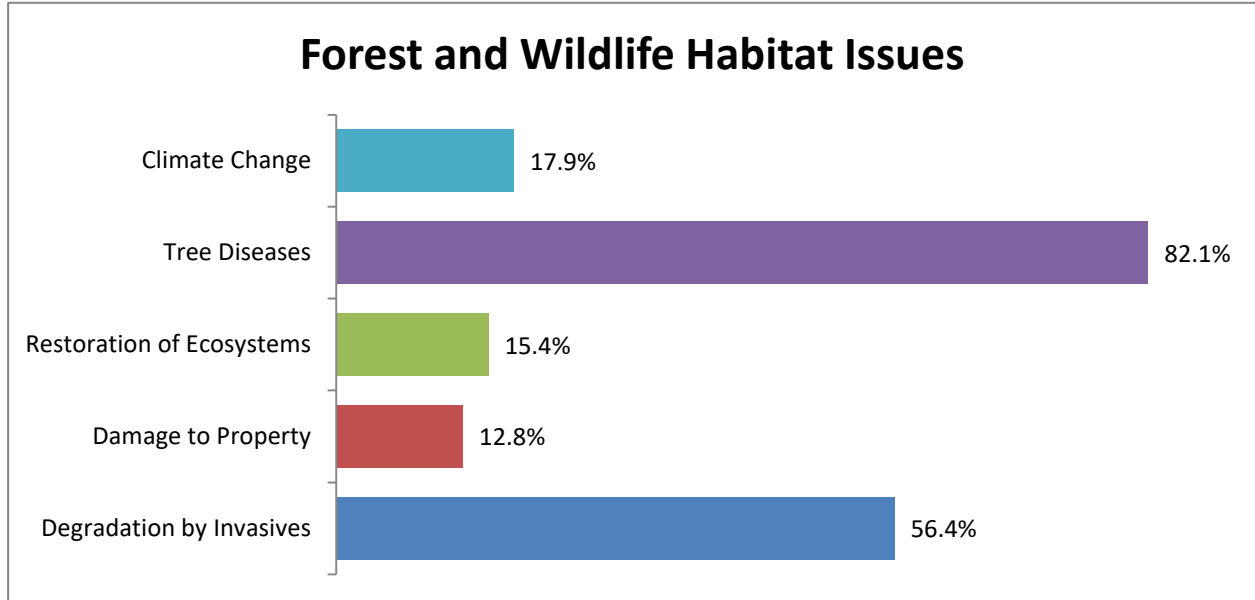
