Clergy Column

Any time a faithful Christian in our modern world notices sinful behavior and ever-so-gently tries to encourage the sinner not to sin, it seems as if the Christian is shouted down by popular culture and social media, saying "Don't be so judgmental. Christians aren't supposed to condemn anyone." This is a canard. A canard, other than being the French word for duck, is also a false story or rumor, or to use modern language, it is a false "narrative." Anti-Christians have developed and beaten us over the head with this cheap canard that Christians should not judge, based upon the teaching of Jesus; so we should, more or less, just keep our mouths shut and say nothing when we see clear and present sin before us. This canard has worked far too well to shut us up. The people using this narrative against us fundamentally misunderstand Jesus in today's Gospel. Jesus encounters the woman caught in adultery. Some irate villagers drag her before Jesus, hoping that he will condemn her, so that they can begin the punishment designated by Jewish law: stoning to death. In a moment of holy genius, Jesus says that the one without sin should throw the first stone. Everyone walks away, one by one, and the woman and Jesus are left alone. He told her that he did not condemn her, that he would not pass judgment, however, he did tell her that she should sin no more.

The error of the narrative used against us is confusion about the word condemn. Condemn, does not mean pointing out sin and calling someone to stop sinning: conversion. Condemn, in its precise sense, means to pass a definitive judgement and carry out a sentence. That is what the villagers wanted. They wanted an authority figure to pronounce her guilty, so they could carry out her sentence of stoning. Jesus did not do this because he believed this woman could live a life of virtue. He believed that she could repent and change her ways, and he did not want to condemn her, because that condemnation would mean death, and that would mean she would have no chance to repent. If we understand the word condemn precisely, then Christians should not pass a definitive judgement on someone and say that he or she has no hope of changing his or her ways. However, like Jesus who did not condemn the woman, but still called her to conversion, we should also still call sinners to repentance and give them every means of assistance to help them come back to the Lord.
