- President/Vice President Report
 - o Police Commissioner's BHM Event on 2/16/23
 - Mark and Kim attended this event. Commissioner shared with them a lot of the activities the police were doing in our neighborhood to make things better and be more transparent. Such as additional training of police and use of body cameras. With cameras they have said it has resulted in better interactions. Learned police curse a lot. Commissioner confirmed they will work on that. When police pull someone over they are supposed to introduce themselves and indicate that they are recording for the safety of both parties. They are receiving training on site interactions to teach individuals on the spot
 - Mark: commissioners and chiefs were open and honest. He expressed his concerns about how community members are being perceived in general. The Commissioner acknowledged it.
 - Did he say anything about the crossing guard issues? Meta brought it up. BCA brought up the pay scale was \$25 per hour and he said they were going to make it more appealing with benefits.
 - Meta working with the county legislature and the police budget for crossing guard new hires to get benefits. Still need a list of candidates because of attrition and people have retired. If residents have issues please send a list.
 - Elissa. Residents need to be nicer to the crossing guards. Not screaming at them or not stopping when children are crossing. Seen kids almost get hit because of 3 point turns and crossing guards are trying to protect our children. Meta-almost been hit trying to get to the high school. Officers at the crossing guard post can't leave their post.
 - Police Commissioner's Council

- BCA is now participating. Rodney and Mark will be on this council moving forward
 - Meta is on the first precinct council. It was put on hold due to covid. It was very successful in the past. She asked the commissioner about it. He said he was interested but his model was to have a round robin throughout the precincts. We want to really focus on our community issue and first precinct. especially with all that is going on with redistricting. Kim chimed in that she agreed about this.
 - Action item: Mark to inquire about the first precinct council.
- South Hempstead Civic Association
 - Marguerite attended their meeting. They have been kept whole for the county and possibly the TOH. It was a fact finding mission.
 Baldwin was on his own.
 - Reached out to Fred Brewington office to join the lawsuit. (this was a suggestion by a member to join on to a lawsuit). Karen was reaching out to another attorney to inquire about it, what were the details, timeline and the cost factor so that we can make a decision as a group. Membership feedback?
 - I think we should absolutely especially in name and not money
 - Pearl Jacobs from Uniondale spoke about TOH separating them at hempstead turnpike. Kellenberg and another place was cut out of uniondale. Goosby voting in favor of dividing the minority community
 - Kim spoke about being at the last TOH hearing. At the meeting people inquired about when they were voting. Once public comment was done they immediately voted and the Town board voted unanimously to approve the maps
 - Brewington proposed maps that split Uniondale.
 - For Baldwin we want to keep things whole
 - Difficult when you have to keep the places a certain size. Villages can't be split so they look to hamlets to break them up
 - 54 communities kept whole, 2 were split and ours was one of them

- Meta: be careful about joining lawsuit.
 Check bylaws. Wouldn't agree with BCA participating in a lawsuit
 - Need to get folks registered to vote. It is crucial. County maps aren't as bad. 30-40 people in Malverne showed up and advocated. Plainview and Old Bethpage was present and within 24 hours they were kept whole. Presiding officer did not understand why people were upset yet 15/19 districts impacted are predominantly democratic
- Attended hearing and brewington did have a sign up list where baldwin residents signed up to be plaintiffs (resident and first time attendee)

She argued with them. Puts us in Goosby district to the north and to the south we are in there with oceanside where there is no representative
- Vision Long Island Albany trip rescheduled to March 14
 - Bus slid off the road prior to the trip starting. LI lobby coalition. Find common ground from the different communities. Affordable housing is one of the issues. They aren't against this just against mandates. Packaging-when we do recycling TOH pays for it. They want the producers to pay for that.

- o Why?
 - Last renovation was done in 2005. Community needs have changed and the state of the world has changed. They had a survey with community members telling them what they wanted to see. They had a series of community meetings where people told them what they wanted to see. Last time there was a referendum there was insufficient funds in the bond to complete the proposed renovation
 - Worked with architects from H2M
 - 2nd floor: Raw space could be split into another community room and a smaller community room. High demand for the small rooms for folks to study. Can also be used for business rooms if folks are working remotely. Coffee. More comfortable seating. Adding maker's space. podcasting/video casting room. A teen zone that is double the size of the space that is downstairs. Also a gaming room.
 - HVAC systems and portion of the roof needs to be replace:
 \$ 3.1 million of total project
 - 1st floor: Children's room doesn't allow a lot of natural light and better space. Story hour room will become a play area. Instead of two small rooms, one for arts and crafts. Story time room moves. Reference desk is moved to the middle of the room. Dedicated baldwin history room. Better office for their social worker (social work consultant). Also will have a passport office. Updates to the media room. More requests from the teen space converted to a tween space. Programming in there. In the morning space can be used by seniors. Smaller circulation desk.





Will start fresh in early summer. Planted tulip bulbs. Next step is for the lights. \$700 of string lights along merrick rd and grand ave. Marguerite has been playing phone tag with Doug of the Baldwin Fire Department. She wants to see if the lights look right, if not, she will return them. Latest she can spend PSEG grant money is March 2024. Everything she uses the money for must be concentrated in the downtown area.
- Kim shared that the BCA is hoping to reapply for the PSEG grant next year. We want to keep bringing in funds to offset our budget. She expressed appreciation to Marguerite for all of the work she has done with the 2023 grant funds.
