

Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word

-Daniel 7:13–14 The dominion of the Son of man is an everlasting dominion.

-Psalm 93 "The Lord is king; he is robed in majesty."

-Revelation 1:5–8 The ruler of the kings of the earth has made us into a kingdom, priests for his God and Father.

-John 18:33b–37 You say I am a king.

In today's first reading, we hear Daniel's vision of a Son of man receiving kingship from God over an eternal dominion. As Christians, we understand this prophecy to be fulfilled in Jesus, who often referred to himself as the Son of Man. We also hear a vision from Revelation in which Jesus comes again in glory. The Gospel narrates the scene in which Jesus is questioned by Pilate about his kingship, which he cannot understand. Let us listen to God's word, aware that Jesus came into the world to testify to the truth.



From the Worship Office:

Feast of the Immaculate Conception: December 8th falls on Sunday this year, consequently the Feast of the Immaculate Conception is transferred to Monday December 9th. Initially this was not a Holy Day of Obligation. An inquiry was made to Rome and Rome returned with a decision that in this case the Holy Day Obligation **cannot be abrogated**. Consequently, The Feast of the Immaculate Conception is transferred to the December 9th and **IS A HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION.**

Please remember that if you celebrate a Sunday evening Mass on December 8th that mass must be for the 2nd Sunday of Advent. Also, keep in mind the Holy Day Obligation is for 2 masses so in some cases, even though the readings may be the same, a person could count the Sunday evening mass for their Holy Day Obligation. For instance, if someone participated in the 8:00 am mass on Sunday, and then the 5:00 pm mass on Sunday evening (both masses for the 2nd Sunday of Advent), that person would be deemed as fulfilling both their Sunday obligation and their Holy Day obligation.

Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati (1901-1925) was born in Turin, Italy to a prominent and wealthy family. He attended a state school until he was 14 when he was sent to a private run by the Jesuits. While at school he became a member of the Marian Sodality and the Apostleship of Prayer. He also obtained permission to receive daily Communion which was rare at that time. At 17, he joined the St. Vincent de Paul Society. He demonstrated his commitment to care for the poor and sick, helping demobilized servicemen returning from World War I, and giving his bus fare to those in need. Pier Giorgio had an intense prayer life, spending hours in eucharistic adoration and daily praying a rosary on his knees by his bedside.

This vibrant young man was also an avid outdoorsman. He loved mountainclimbing, hiking, riding horses, skiing, and sharing jokes and pranks with his friends. He used these activities to share his Faith, an apostolate of persuasion. He always carried a rosary and was known to give them away to his friends. He was an active member in many Catholic student groups. He opposed fascism at a dangerous time in Italy's history. He was arrested during a demonstration at Young Catholic Workers Congress in Rome. In 1922, he joined the Third Order of St. Dominic. Unfortunately, he contracted polio, likely from

the poor he served so diligently, at the age of 24 and died just six days later.

This handsome young man has become a global patron for youth and young adults. Like many young people he had difficulties with exams and problems with his parents, but he formed his life around Jesus. St. John Paul II declared him a patron for World Youth Days. He was beatified in 1990. Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati, pray for us!
