Normal Can Be Highly Overrated

Vincent van Gogh is best remembered as a troubled but highly talented post-impressionist painter who died at 37. Let me share some things about van Gogh that you may not know.

He was drawn toward the Christian ministry at an early age. In the winter of 1878, he volunteered to move to an impoverished coal mine in south Belgium, a place where pastors were usually sent as punishment. He preached and ministered to the sick and drew pictures of miners and their families, who called him the "Christ of the Coal Mines." He identified with them in a powerful way.

He lived as simply as they did. He gave away his good clothes to the poor and dressed in shabby clothing.

One day, a baker's wife with whom he had boarded, asked why he had given away his good clothing. He replied, "I am a friend of the poor like Jesus was." Not impressed, she told him, "You are no longer normal."

The governing body in the church agreed with her. They disagreed with his lifestyle and refused to renew his contract. He was forced to find another occupation. I suppose it was then he devoted himself to art

That baker's wife was correct, though. He was not normal. But what does it mean to be normal? She said he wasn't normal because he tried to follow Jesus. Is that bad? Well, if you truly try to be all that Christ calls you to be, I suspect she was right, you will be anything but normal or ordinary.

Isn't this basically what the majority of us seek? We want to be considered normal, to fit in, to be accepted. Perhaps the meanest thing you can say to another in our super-conformist culture is, "You are not normal." I wonder, however, if the world will ever be changed for the better by people whose greatest ambition is to fit in

Being abnormal is not always bad, normal is highly overrated! Do you think Mother Teresa was normal? I think most of us agree that no normal person would make the sacrifices that she made. That's why she is a saint.



The Methodist Message

So is it bad to be abnormal? Not if you're willing to pay the price. Would you agree it's all right to be abnormal if in doing so you change and change the world for Christ? Would you agree that it would be all right to be abnormal if it meant you left your little part of the world a better place? Let me ask again - is it so bad to be abnormal?

In the Epistle of James he proclaims, "My brothers and sisters, believers in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ must not show favoritism. Suppose a man comes into your meeting wearing a gold ring and fine clothes, and a poor man in filthy old clothes also comes in. If you show special attention to the man wearing fine clothes and say, 'Here's a good seat for you,' but say to the poor man, 'You stand there' or 'Sit on the floor by my feet,' have you not discriminated among yourselves and become judges with evil thoughts? Listen, my dear brothers and sisters: Has not God chosen those who are poor in the eyes of the world to be rich in faith and to inherit the kingdom he promised those who love him?"

The author of James isn't writing to the government about its attitudes toward the poor. He isn't writing to the poor to chastise them about how they use their money.

He's writing to us in the church and asking us if we pass judgment on people according to their economic status, a practice that, regrettably, is quite normal.

What James is saying to us is that following Jesus calls us to an abnormal attitude toward people.

We are to see all people as Jesus sees them - as loved, as worthy, as important in the Kingdom of God. That's an abnormal way of looking at life, but that is the Jesus way. How normal is it for the son of God to give his life for our sins.

Thank God, Jesus was abnormal. If he wasn't we wouldn't have a chance. Why would any normal being give their life on a cross for a sinful world?

SPARE RIBS WITH BOURBON PEACH GLAZE


- 1 slab large spare ribs or 2 slabs baby back ribs • 2 tsp kosher salt

- · 2 tsp garlic powder
- 2 tsp smoked paprika

SWEET & SMOKY RUB

- 1 tsp onion powder
- 1 tsp ground mustard
- 1/2 tsp black pepper • 1/2 tsp chili powder
- 1/8 tsp cayenne pepper
- 1/4 cup brown sugai Yields 3/4 cup
- **BOURBON PEACH GLAZE**
- 18 oz peach preserves
- 1/2 cup bourbon
- · 2 T apple cider vinegar • 1 tsp kosher salt
- PREPARATION
- Mix all of the rub ingredients together in a bowl. Use a fork to make sure all the brown sugar is
- Remove the membrane from backside of ribs. Begin in one corner by running a knife between membrane and rib. Grip the loosened membrane with a paper towel and pull away from rib Rinse ribs under cool water and pat dry.
- Pour some of the rub on both sides of the ribs and ensure the entire slab is well coated Refrigerate for up to 24 hours before grilling.
- Combine ingredients of glaze together in a sauce pot. Bring to a boil and cook for 5
- minutes, whisking often. Allow to cool. Prepare a grill using indirect heat, with coals on only one side of the grill. Keep the
- temperature between 300-325 degrees. Place the ribs on opposite side of the grill away from flames. Cook ribs for 1 hour. Remove ribs and wrap in foil. Return wrapped ribs to grill and cook another 2 hours. Remove ribs from foil and return to grill for 1 hour. Begin to baste ribs during the last 30 minutes of cooking. Total cook time is 4 hours. Meat should be pulling away from the bones.

Serve any remaining glaze along side the cooked ribs.

LRP Earns Another Grant For Gazebo/Bandshell

Lillian Recreational Park has been awarded a \$25,000 grant from the Hearin-Chandler Foundation.

Plans are to use \$15,000 of the grant to build a bandshell/gazebo at the park and \$10,000 will be used to make improvements to the kiddie park, including installing new fencing and a shade structure.

Once the gazebo is finished this fall, it will be available for community and private events such as weddings and birthdays. It is expected one of the inaugural events in the

gazebo will be "Hot Chocolate with Santa" at the park's new Christmas in the Park celebration to be held Dec. 7.

The park anticipates holding regular concerts and other musical events in the bandshell beginning next year.

Earlier this year, the park received a \$3,000 grant from the National Association of Realtors as initial funding for the bandshell. The Hearin-Chandler grant and other community donations received will fund the balance. Construction is expected to start later this month.




Coverage won't last long unless they tax you until you bleed. We aren't and shouldn't be a socialist country.


