A. Consider and Discuss Ordinance No. 0-2017-14

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CISCO, TEXAS, ADOPTING A COMPREHENSIVE ZONING PLAN AND ZONING MAP AND DIVIDING THE CITY INTO SEVERAL DISTRICTS; ESTABLISHING AND PROVIDING FOR ZONING REGULATIONS AND CREATING ZONING DISTRICTS IN ACCORDANCE WITH A COMPREHENSIVE PLAN; WITHIN SUCH DISTRICTS REGULATING THE USE OF LAND, BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES; REGULATING THE HEIGHT, SIZE, AND LOCATIONS OF BUILDINGS; ESTABLISHING DENSITY, OPEN SPACE, SCREENING, AND MINIMUM OFF-STREET PARKING REQUIREMENTS; REGULATING THE ERECTION, REPAIR, AND ALTERATION OF ALL BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES; PROVIDING FOR SPECIFIC USE PERMITS FOR CERTAIN USES; RECOGNIZING NONCONFORMING USES AND STRUCTURES AND PROVIDING RULES FOR THE REGULATION THEREOF; PROVIDING FOR CERTIFICATES OF OCCUPANCY AND COMPLIANCE; DEFINING CERTAIN TERMS; PROVIDING A METHOD OF AMENDMENT; PROVIDING A PENALTY FOR VIOLATION OF SUCH ORDINANCE AND FOR INJUNCTIVE RELIEF TO PERSONS AFFECTED BY THE VIOLATION OF SAID ORDINANCE; PROVIDING A SAVING CLAUSE. (*First Reading*)

Mr. Archer explained that he had found that Damon Berryman was certified to do all inspections needed to comply with the proposed planning and zoning ordinance.

B. Consider and Discuss Ordinance No. 0-2017-15

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CISCO, TEXAS, AMENDING CERTAIN SECTIONS OF CHAPTER 12 "LICENSES AND BUSINESS REGULATIONS"; ADDING ARTICLE III "JUNKYARDS"; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE. (*First Reading*)

Mayor King explained that Mr. Wright had issues with the ordinance and had not yet signed off on its legality. Mayor King went on to suggest tabling the item until Mr. Wright was satisfied. Councilmember Weger countered that he would like to see an ordinance specifically prohibiting junkyards in the city limits.

D. Consider and Discuss Resolution No. 2017-11-13-01

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CISCO, TEXAS, AUTHORIZING THE SUBMISSION OF A COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT & REVITALIZATION 2015 NON-HOUSING PROJECT APPLICATION TO THE GENERAL LAND OFFICE; AND AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR AND/OR CITY MANAGER TO ACT AS THE CITY'S EXECUTIVE OFFICER AND AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE IN ALL MATTERS PERTAINING TO THE CITY'S PARTICIPATION IN THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT & REVITALIZATION PROGRAM.

Mr. Archer explained informed the Council that this grant would be for a maximum of \$1,000,000.00 with a cost of \$10,000.00 to the city. He suggests we apply for the full amount and the proceeds will go toward bridge and culvert repair on W. 14th Street, W. 10th Street, and by Thornton Feed Mill.

E. Consider and Discuss Closing Additional Streets for the Lighted Christmas Parade.

Mary Rains, Chamber of Commerce Director, advised the Council that she had requested this item be on the agenda to close W. 9th Street from Conrad Hilton Blvd to Ave E, W. 10th Street from Conrad Hilton Blvd. to Ave E, and Ave E between W. 10th and W. 11th Streets to use for staging areas for the Lighted Christmas Parade. She mentioned that in years previous there had been safety concerns with participants while waiting for the parade to begin. Councilmember Douglas echoed those concerns. Mr. Archer suggested a more palatable closing would be W. 9th and 10th from Conrad Hilton Blvd to Ave E. and Ave E between W. 9th and W. 10th Streets thereby leaving the street in front of Brookshire's open to traffic for patrons.

Motion was made by Councilmember Weger to allow the street closing suggested by Mr. Archer, second was made by Councilmember Douglas. Motion prevailed by the following vote:

F. Consider and Discuss RAMP Grant
