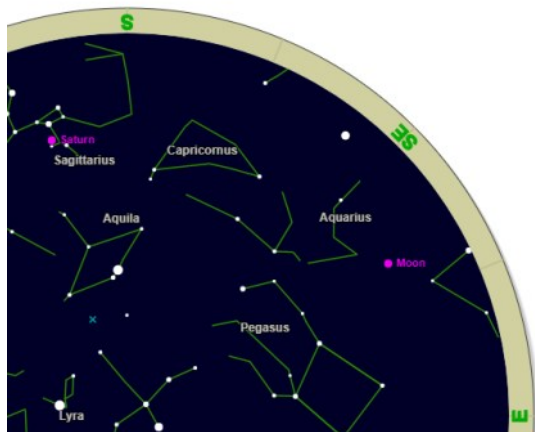

**MORE GREEN BOAT
CLEANING TIPS**
(FROM BOAT US)



1. Rinse your boat with freshwater when possible, especially if trailering. This will reduce the frequency needed for detergent washings.
2. Apply a good boat wax at least once a year. It will help prevent dirt, bird droppings and other gunk from adhering to the boat surface.
3. Follow manufacturer's instructions, especially for diluting cleaning products! Testing showed that increasing the detergent to water ratio *DID NOT IMPROVE* cleaning!
4. Always clean your boat out of the water when possible. This helps keep detergents out of the water.
5. Most products are not fully "green" and are best used in an area that does not drain directly to the water to help keep the detergents out of the water.
6. Always start using less and then increase as needed to help clean. Rinse and wipe first—maybe detergents are not needed.
7. Use a general-purpose cleaner overall and then spot clean tougher stains.
8. Avoid cleaning in full sun. Warmer temperatures will make cleaners evaporate faster into the air and you'll use more product.

GREEN CORN MOON



The August full moon is also known as the Sturgeon Moon (since sturgeon are more easily caught in August and early September according to the Old Farmer's Almanac), Red Moon (since it often takes on a reddish hue in the summer haze), Grain Moon (from the Old English/Anglo-Saxon Lunar Calendar), and Green Corn Moon (as it marked the time when corn was fully grown).

It always shines among or near the stars of Aquarius or Capricornus. Full moons rise at sunset and set at sunrise. According to sky.com since this full moon phase will occur in the morning daylight hours, the moon will appear to be full **on both Wednesday and Thursday** evenings in the Americas!
