Our trip will then head to Pocahontas IL. to see how a couple have renovated the town square using lots of paint and elbow grease and adding some neat little stores.

Last stop — Marcoots dairy. A local farm family who chose to use their Jersey Milk to produce cheeses, Ice Cream, and other dairy products and then sell them in the city and thru some local groceries.

That will end our day. Please note this schedule could change at any time due to unforeseen time restraints.
