Our Gospel today opens with the people gazing upon and celebrating how gorgeous the temple is. On this gloomy November afternoon I am almost thinking that the glorious summer we have just experienced, coupled with the warm and colourful fall has come to an end, and a hard winter is about to come crashing down on us. It is a little like Jesus' prophecy. Who could believe that this glorious temple would not stand the test of time.

I worry that our Earth, this precious home God created for us, may come to a similar conclusion, if we do not take responsibility and I mean very soon.

Pope Francis has the same concerns. Let us explore what worries him, so that we may join in the necessary work to save the planet. From the first section of Laudato Si' (quotation begins)

19. Following a period of irrational confidence in progress and human abilities, some sectors of society are now adopting a more critical approach. We see increasing sensitivity to the environment and the need to protect nature, along with a growing concern, both genuine and distressing, for what is happening to our planet. Let us review, however cursorily, those questions which are troubling us today and which we can no longer sweep under the carpet. Our goal is not to amass information or to satisfy curiosity, but rather to become painfully aware, to dare to turn what is happening to the world into our own personal suffering and thus to discover what each of us can do about it.

I. POLLUTION AND CLIMATE CHANGE Pollution, waste and the throwaway culture

22. These problems are closely linked to a throwaway culture which affects the excluded just as it quickly reduces things to rubbish. To cite one example, most of the paper we produce is thrown away and not recycled. It is hard for us to accept that the way natural ecosystems work is exemplary: plants synthesize nutrients which feed herbivores; these in turn become food for carnivores, which produce significant quantities of organic waste which give rise to new generations of plants. But our industrial system, at the end of its cycle of production and consumption, has not developed the capacity to absorb and reuse waste and by-products. We have not yet managed to adopt a circular model of production capable of preserving resources for present and future generations, while limiting as much as possible the use of non-renewable resources, moderating their consumption, maximizing their efficient use, reusing and recycling them. A serious consideration of this issue would be one way of counteracting the throwaway culture which affects the entire planet, but it must be said that only limited progress has been made in this regard.

Climate as a common good

23. The climate is a common good, belonging to all and meant for all. At the global level, it is a complex system linked to many of the essential conditions for human life. A very solid scientific consensus indicates that we are presently witnessing a disturbing warming of the climatic system. In recent decades this warming has been accompanied by a constant rise in the sea level and, it would appear, by an increase of extreme weather events, even if a scientifically determinable cause cannot be assigned to each particular phenomenon. Humanity is called to recognize the need for changes of lifestyle, production and consumption, in order to combat this warming or at least the human causes which produce or aggravate it. It is true that there are other factors (such as volcanic activity, variations in the earth's orbit and axis, the solar cycle), yet a number of scientific studies indicate that most global warming in recent decades is due to the great concentration of greenhouse gases (carbon dioxide, methane, nitrogen oxides and others) released mainly as a result of human activity. As these gases build up in the atmosphere, they hamper the escape of heat produced by sunlight at the earth's surface. The problem is aggravated by a model of development based on the intensive use of fossil fuels, which is at the heart of the worldwide energy system. Another determining factor has been an increase in changed uses of the soil, principally deforestation for agricultural purposes. (End of quotation)

We have become so very anesthetized to our throwaway society. Nothing is repairable anymore. We just throw it away and get new. Garbage and their toxins seeping into our environment. Our garbage is being shipped off to foreign countries to let the poor deal with the problem. Who was not concerned about the recent election in Brazil where the fate of the Amazon rainforest may have been held in the balance. The problem has not been solved, only temporarily put off. Let us pray. Let us act. Let us be genuine stewards of this home we have been given dominion over by our God.


