
ALICE MATANISIGA



BEN MOODY

Tour Director

Ben has been associated with Ringwood Secondary College since 2000, when he began his journey with RSC Performing Arts as the Musical Director of the College Production. At the time, he was studying a number of degrees at Monash University, but eventually decided to actually complete one of them and graduated with a Bachelor of Music. He followed this with a secondary teaching diploma in Music and Legal Studies and has been teaching since 2001.

Since 2006 at Ringwood, Ben has taught a wide variety of subjects: Music, English, Legal Studies, Drama, French, Business Management and Humanities. Whether this is emblematic of restless impatience or a spirit of endeavour he has no idea, but has always been willing to "have a crack" as required. He has been a student coordinator at many year levels and involved in a huge array of wider school activities. He also completed three quarters of a Masters in School Leadership and may even get around to working out how to possibly finish it - or even attempt something else - some time prior to 2045.

As the Director of Performing Arts since 2011, Ben has overseen a number of productions and tours, hosted international visiting performance groups from partner schools and continued to expand the Performing Arts' reach into both local and global communities. He has been nominated three times for Director of the Year by the Music Theatre Guild of Victoria and, in 2015, directed the College Production of "Oliver!", a steampunk-inspired interpretation which won the Guild Award for Best Youth Production in the state. While this was a significant career highlight, Ben is still unsure as to whether or not it comes close to the exhilaration of winning the Novice Fours Lawn Bowls at the Victorian Teachers' Games in 2010.

No-one knows the story of the World Tour quite like Ben. He has participated in all five previous tours (only for a few days in 2004, when he was working at host school Sandwich Technology School in the UK) and taken great enjoyment in watching its evolution. As the Musical Director of the tours in 2001, 2007 and 2010, he has played a large role in developing the scope, ambition and complexity of the touring performance. In 2013, Ben stepped into the role of Tour Director and spearheaded the creation of "The Spirit of Melbourne", the first of the tour shows to incorporate a sustained character narrative and employ subtitles. This year, Ben has handed much more responsibility to the "Show Team" of staff - an immensely talented (and much younger) group of dedicated teachers who have taken 2016's production, entitled "Made in Melbourne", to another level yet again.

In 2015, Ben returned to the stage himself for the first time in years, performing the role of Sir Dennis Galahad in MLOC Productions' season of "Spamalot". Having enjoyed the experience immensely, he is determined not to leave it so long before finding another opportunity, and will shamelessly, continuously and fervently encourage everyone to come and see it when it happens.



LACHLAN MACKAY

Musical & Technical Director

Lachlan is an educator, musician, composer and technical buff from the Eastern suburbs of Melbourne.

He began his association with Ringwood Secondary College as a student before studying Trombone at the Conservatorium of Music, University of Melbourne, graduating with a Bachelor of Music in 2009 and a Post Graduate Diploma of Teaching in 2010.

Whilst studying, he worked in casual positions at various schools gaining valuable experience as a conductor and instrumental teacher. In 2011, he began fulltime work at RSC and currently teaches junior, senior, and instrumental music conducting both jazz and wind ensembles. He holds the position of Head of Performing Arts (curriculum), Events Manager, and has previously been a Student Coordinator.

Lachlan remains an active musician, playing in school and amateur productions as well as with orchestras, jazz bands, wind ensembles, and ska bands. He has an enthusiasm for all things music technology whether it be recording in his studio or spinning the disks as his DJ alter ego.

He has received 5 Lyrebird nominations for Lighting and Musical Direction and in 2015 received a nomination for Musical Direction in the award winning RSC production of Oliver (his 15th RSC production) from the Music Theatre Guild of Victoria.

Lachlan's proudest musical achievement was writing his first junior musical "The Living Museum", which sold out to audiences nearing two thousand in 2011.

Having been Musical and Technical Director of "The Spirit of Melbourne" in 2013, Lachlan is thrilled to once again have the opportunity to tour with such talented students and staff.

Choreographer

Gaynor has been associated with Ringwood Secondary College since 2014, attaining a job after completing a Bachelor of Arts / Bachelor of Teaching (Secondary) at Deakin University.
