Royal Valuta (AKA Peanuts) was bred in Echunga by a dear friend of mine, Jenny Edwards. I saw him when he was about 6 months old and instantly fell in love with him. His sire is the gorgeous Royal Hit and he is out of a Valuta mare. Jenny weaned him and brought him to my house when he was 9 months old. He was my dream horse and I enjoyed every moment I could get to know him as he was growing up. He watched me from the gate as I rode the children's ponies, waiting for his turn.

In January 2014 when Peanuts was two years old, I was diagnosed with terminal bowel cancer and all my dreams of ever riding him vanished. I had surgery within days and started chemotherapy soon after. In May 2014 I had a liver resection to remove cancer from my liver but I knew after that that I would still try to break him in and go as far as I could until I needed help. I

had nothing to lose. In August 2014, Peanuts officially turned three and I slowly started to break him in. He made everything so easy; I don't think he even felt me up there much, I weighed 43kg and I probably felt like a fly. But his temperament allowed me to do all of it myself with the help of friends and coaches.

The AOR Pryde's High Point series over the last two years has given me a goal and I am incredibly grateful for that. Some days, I found it hard to continue riding this massive giant who just wouldn't stop growing despite me pleading with him. He is strong and not always keen to give me what I need from him, I'm sure this is mostly my fault for not being strong and clear but the Series made me get up and keep trying anyway.

I want to thank all the Clubs who have hosted the Series; we could not have asked for kinder people to look after us. Thank you also to all to volunteers on our dressage committees who make all this happen and to all the friends I have made in our dressage communities who are there for me every day. I have had the support of a few coaches over the years and they have all given me so much help in different ways that I could not have done without, thank you all so much. Most of all thank you to Pryde's for sponsoring such great series. And of course, thanks Peanuts, you are my heart horse. You look after me every time I ride you, you try your best and you improve slowly all the time. I have retired now from competition and can only ride once or twice a week but I can just get on, never worried now that you will do something stupid and you still allow me to escape everything else while I am riding you, even if it's only for a few precious minutes.

Thank you to Judy and Cecile for sharing your stories about your wonderful equine partners and the journey you are on.

The Welfare of Horses By Helen Whittle Credit to Julie Fiedler (Horse SA)and Julie Fiedler

Fortunately for horses, we are starting to see a shift from "horse care" to "horse welfare". Owners (some) are starting to see a bigger picture, realising that the needs of animals are greater than feed and shelter. Governments around the world are beginning to think about bringing "animal sentience" into law (New Zealand has and the ACT is on its way). The idea that animals are able to feel and perceive the world would seem a given to any animal lover and this is way overdue.

Advocating for continuous improvement in horse welfare is an important part of Horse SA's work. In February a seminar was held with delegates from around the world and in May Dr Andrew McLean did a short follow-up lecture. Many resources have been created to assist owners, including: 'Natural Paddocks, Un-natural Behaviours' and 'Tips For The Care Of Confined Horses'. In recent years workplace safety educational events have included horse welfare as it relates to the work, sport or recreational employee and volunteer work context. Past projects co-ordinated by Horse SA include the Australian Horse Welfare & Well-being Toolkit, Australian Horse Welfare Protocol, Welfare pocket-guide, and the AHIC welfare check-list for organisations: 'A Paradigm Shift From Care To Welfare'- interview with Professor Emeritus David Mellor with Horses and People Magazine.

Closely linked to welfare is the impact these shifts will have on our sport, ie our **social licence to operate**. Broadly speaking *social licence to operate* refers to the public acceptance of our activities. With every spectator having access to a phone / camera, we have to be able to justify what we do and what we accept.

It is possible for enough public pressure to occur to make any sport lose their social licence. In 2018, British Horse Racing was questioned about its welfare practices in the UK Parliament as a result of an electronic petition with over 100,000 signatures. In 2015 the FEI removed the last two UAE endurance ride events of the year from their calendar, citing horse welfare (ie public pressure) as the reason for their removal. Social licence is the community's attitude towards horse sport. Traditional practices that we might think OK don't always look good from a public perspective and maybe in the future could be questioned? Whips? Spurs? Double bridles? We have already seen Rollkur in the public spotlight. Horse sport needs to be a step ahead. The public is watching and sponsors also notice. We need to consider how improvements to horse welfare practices could be undertaken and look for ways to engage all stakeholders (riders, owners, supporters, sponsors, officials, judges, coaches, etc) in decision making so that we are *seen* to be doing the right thing.

Horse sports can be viewed world-wide 24/7 from tv or smart phones live streaming. Good for promoting sport, but when it comes to horse welfare, the audience is potentially naïve and applies their own values. What your organisation thinks is a suitable welfare standard may not seem so for people outside our sport. It's important to be able to explain to the public in animal welfare terms, what we do and why.

The same technology and social media platforms that seem to cause the problems can be used to create positive messages. This is one way an organisation can take a lead. Posting regular updates on social media of welfare related achievements creates a positive digital footprint. Social licence to operate is not an afterthought. Every sport, every organisation will need to work out what it means to keep and maintain a Social Licence.

EA Concussion Protocols - Implementation for all disciplines 1 July 2019

28 May 2019

Dear EA Athletes/Parents, Coaches & Officials,

With this being said, Equestrian Australia fully endorses the Concussion in Sport Australia Position Statement, which can be located at: www.sportaus.gov.au/ais/position statements#concussion

Consistent with its support for the Concussion in Sport Australia Position Statement,

Equestrian Australia will introduce a similar protocol for all equestrian disciplines Effective July 1st 2019.

To assist with the introduction of these protocols, Equestrian Australia is undertaking education and communication programs for all stakeholders including athletes, officials, coaches, parents and guardians.

As part of this, we wish to provide all athletes/parents, coaches and officials with access to the PDF version of a presentation which may be seen presented at future events (please click on links below), highlighting:

- the key points of the protocols,
- the OC & Officials' role in implementing the protocol,
- how to recognise concussion and

- * Gear checking is done to ensure a safe and fair competition. Please make sure you report to the gear checker before your test on Official days or risk Elimination.
- * Many hands make light work! Volunteers are vital to enabling our events to run smoothly and help is always appreciated.







Rider Profile: Kim Zohs

Name: Kim Zohs

Age: 37

When did you start riding / first mount? I started riding when I was probably around six or seven. My aunty dropped a pony at our place for a stay. That probably lasted two years. She was a grey Shetland named "Poppy" and I am pretty sure she was the first ride I had.

What disciplines do you/have you ridden? Campdrafting (briefly) and dressage (present).

Tell us about your riding career so far: Having grown up on a farm in the mid north, horses were the devil around here. I never owned a pony of my own until I turned 16. We always had horses on the farm, but never our own. They were often dropped here on agistment when times were tough and they had extended stays. I learned to ride on a couple of different ponies that stayed with us: the grey Shetland above and a black Welsh X that my uncle dropped off. Both lacked lots of training, had no brakes, ran away with you etc, etc. The type of pony I wouldn't let my kids on.

My family are not horse people: Mum was scared of them and Dad wanted to shoot them. I never did Pony Club as a child / teenager; I just hacked around the farm moving sheep on whatever pony I could find. We never had a saddle or bridle and I rode bareback with a halter, sometimes all day, riding from farm to farm which was 8km one way.

In later years, after having kids, I decided I wanted to get back into horses and chose campdrafting as my discipline. It didn't last too long: a friend convinced me to go to a Dressage Club and I loved the atmosphere and the accuracy of riding different figures. I started riding at MSEDC before returning to the mid north.

My career highlight was getting my own pony when I was 16. Her name was Springwood Sunflower - a beautiful buckskin Riding Pony mare. She loved the farm work too. She was well educated and was a superb ride. I loved that pony.

What are your most valued achievements? I feel I don't really have a most-valued achievement. I feel like I am learning every day. Last week, I braved my jumping fear and have started jumping a few poles; albeit only 20cm high.

What are your future aspirations/goals: I have this dream of riding Medium. Hopefully I can make it.

Where do you see yourself in 10 years time? Still here, with my pony Ben.

What would your dream horse look like? I always like the flash looking ones. I am a sucker for a chestnut with four socks and a blaze! I always wanted a QH but that probably won't do for Dressage and I like them on the smaller side. So perhaps a Chestnut GRP with 4 white socks and a blaze ...







close up.



2019 ESA State Autumn Dressage Championships






There was a small but well patronised trade fair and we hope the vendors Equiboost, Mighty Farm, Maxiplas and WOW saddles all had a profitable weekend.



Congratulations: Margie Stuart

During August 1983 a Steering Committee formed to moot the idea of starting a dressage club based at Naracoorte.

"There was a positive response to advertising across the region and on the 30th August 1983 Margie Stuart, who chaired the Steering Committee, was unanimously voted to the position of President to guide the inaugural South East Dressage Club Committee to create a club which would cater for the following act ivies.

Basic equitation, training or otherwise known as Dressage. Knowledge and ability in that area are without doubt the foundation of all current and indeed future equitation, whether interested in Showjumping, Eventing, Hunting, Showing Hacks, or competitive Dressage. This basic training provides riders with greater enjoyment and satisfaction and understanding of the horse.

Alsa to this end they planned non-comp days where riders could test their homework under competitive conditions. As well inviting to stage actual competition days, there was emphasis on good presentation. As the need dictates intend inviting visiting instructors and are hopeful to stage a weeklong or two week school during the inaugural year. Newsletter planned to inform members. Discussions, films, seminars and demonstrations all areas to develop dressage and good training in the region. Numerous discussions with the committees of the EFA (Equestrian Federation of Australia) and the SADA (South Australian Dressage Association) to assist with direction in the formation of such a club." This snippet taken from the Steering Committee's Chairman's report highlights how much Margie's enthusiasm to help got our beloved Club up and running some 36 years ago clearly gave it a good foundation to be continuing in 2019. During its meeting on the 17th June 1984 it was decided to rename the club "The Mid South East Dressage Club". On and off during the years since Margie has supported the Club in many capacities: Treasurer, Judge, Volunteering, putting up arenas, as a writer, hosting visiting judges and instructors and at our Championship Competitions making sure our top flight judges are cared for, fed and present at their arenas with suitable writers, plus also transporting them to their accommodation.

It was such a well deserved award to a loyal Member whose love of the sport has endured more than half a life time. Margie we look forward to your delightful smile at many more Club events in the future.
