 John 2:13-25

“Take these out of here and stop making my Father’s house a marketplace.”

Before this visit to the Jerusalem Jesus had already attracted the scrutiny of the Jewish and Roman rulers. They saw him as a challenge to their authority and power. When Jesus arrived at the Temple he saw the corrupt profiteers who, in collaboration with Jewish leaders, charged poor pilgrims a high percentage to change Roman coins into the Jewish coins they needed to pay the Temple tax and the cost of doves or lambs for sacrifice. He was justifiably angry. He could have politely asked them to take their coins and tables and leave. He probably had done that on other occasions. But this time he acted forcefully to condemn what he knew was not what God intended. Lent is a time for us to reflect on our lives and observe the world in which we live; note the silly, stupid, senseless and sinful things in our life and in the lives of others in our world; and be justifiably angry with ourselves and others. Jesus challenges us to change ourselves and to call other to change.
