## Christian Salvation Doctrines (5<sup>th</sup> to 19<sup>th</sup> Centuries)

- 1. Salvation Requirement in the Roman Catholic Church (5<sup>th</sup> century CE)
  - Member in good standing of the Roman Catholic Church.

- 2. Martin Luther's Salvation Doctrine (1525)
  - Believe in salvation by faith alone without any mixture of or need for good works.

- 3. New Lights Christianity (1679)
  - The primary evidence of salvation is a "personal emotional experience".
- 4. The Niagara Bible Conference (1895)
  - Must believe in the Virgin Birth of Jesus Christ, the Atonement of Jesus for human sins, the physical Resurrection of Jesus, the imminent return of Jesus to Earth and the inerrancy of Scripture (Christian Bible).
