ADLS® is an intense 15-hour course that allows participants to demonstrate competencies in mass casualty management. Educational elements include five lectures (Disasters & Public Health Emergencies; Triage in Disasters; Health System Surge for Disasters & Public Health Emergencies; Community Health Emergency Operations and Response; and Legal and Ethical Issues in Disasters). Essential training components include population scenarios; mass casualty triage tabletop and mass casualty drill, a surge tabletop scenario; personal protective equipment skills performance and decontamination video review; casualty management in small groups with simulated scenarios; and emergency operations center situational training exercise. ADLS requires learners to apply knowledge learned in the BDLIS® courses.

Successful completion of the BDLIS course is a prerequisite for the ADLS course. The target audience for ADLS includes: physicians, nurses, physician assistants, emergency medical technicians (EMTs), paramedics, pharmacists, allied health professionals, and students in health professional schools.
