Bylaws of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, Inc.

ARTICLE VII Doctrine

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers in the saving grace of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ who have accepted him as their personal Saviour. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians), and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. These common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as

Triune God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit

Creation and Formation

Man is basically sinful and in need of Salvation

Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Saviour, which is the conception of Spiritual Life.

Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul and Body. A second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ.

Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by speaking in other languages.

Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

Washing of Feet.

Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers.

Do not condone divorce and remarriage. Matthew 19:8-9 Destruction of the Wicked.

Conditional Immortality.

Rapture of the Man Child Class.

Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly.

A Ministry supported by tithes and offerings.

These basic doctrines shall be adhered to in the teaching of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teachings approved by the Board from time to time if they are not inconsistent with the above listed basic doctrines.

The greatest honor ever bestowed on earthly fathers came when Jesus Christ explained man's relationship to God. He said, "After this manner therefore pray ye: Our Father..." (Matthew 6:9). What a high place He gave to every father on earth!

To the child there are only two persons who can present a clear picture of what God is like: the Lord Jesus and the child's father. The likeness which he sees in Christ, of course, is the better, for He declared, "He that hath seen me hath seen the Father" (John 14:9). In Jesus the child can see the Heavenly Father's care, His sinlessness, His mercy, and His love. And Christ is perfect as the Father in heaven is perfect.

Yet even in this marvelous portrait (if we may dare to say it) there may be two slight drawbacks as far as the child's comprehension is concerned. The first is that, to the child, it is a portrait; it is not flesh and blood. The second is that the Lord Jesus is not the Father but the Son. Though He portrayed God so perfectly, He is forever the Son of God.

This makes it of utmost importance for children to see a likeness of the Heavenly Father in their own fathers, Dads are imperfect, to be sure; Jesus even called them evil. Yet He compared all fathers with God when He said, "If ye then, being evil, know how to give good gifts unto your children, how much more shall your Father which is in heaven give good gifts to them that ask him?" (Matthew 7:11). And dads are on the scene where children can look at them and learn from them.

There are many ways in which earthly fathers portray the Heavenly Father to their children. They want only what is good for them, and they work hard to get it for their children. The child needs food, clothing, and shelter-and the father provides it. The child needs an education, and most fathers are willing to "spend and be spent" to secure this for their children.

When I was but a small boy, my father often reminded me, "Son, you will need to go to college if you expect to amount to

anything when you are a man." I believed him and accepted the goal my father had set for me.

But dads are like God in more ways than just being good providers. Like God, they are request-hearers. Every day they hear petitions such as, "Dad, can I use the car tonight?" "Dad, will you show me how to work this math problem?" Yes, dads hear requests and often supply the answers. And their answers, like God's, are sometimes yes and sometimes

Like the Father in heaven, the earthly dad provides guidance for his child. When a father sees his son trying to make a boat or a kite he loves to help him by making suggestions and guiding the small fingers toward greater skill.

I still treasure the letters of advice my father sent me while I was away at college. How I needed those words of wisdom from one who loved me and desired only the best for me!

What a privilege Joseph had in being the foster-father of the lad Jesus! He must have been a good foster-father, for his Son surely learned from him and (may we say it reverently) came to understand from Joseph's teaching and example what His true Father was like.

Another important thing that dads do is defend their children from danger. This may mean putting up a gate so the little one can't fall down the stairs, or making certain the children are vaccinated against diseases, or cautioning them when they go swimming.

Dads set limits as to place, time, and choice of company for their children. Dads discipline their children by correcting, punishing, and rewarding them. And when children get into trouble, they call on dad to get them out of it. He may tell them where they were wrong but he will also comfort themagain like the Heavenly Father.

Every line of the prayer our Lord taught us seems to reflect homelife with a good father. I will mention but three.

"Hallowed be thy name." For the child there is one name

which means almost everything to him. Whether it be Johnson, Brown, Smith, or Osgood, his family name fills each child with pride and confidence. It means he is a part of the clan, and it is to the clan that he feels the closest tie. The child who has been properly taught will think twice before he does anything that might bring shame on his family name.

Pride in a family name makes it easier for one to say to the Heavenly Father, "Hallowed be thy name." For we are a part of His family now and we want to hold the family Name

"Thy kingdom come." Sooner or later the child will come to understand the purposes his family believes in and the

goals toward which they strive.

My father was a minister and he made the ministry seem a wonderful thing to me. What could be more blessed than to help men find God? That was my father's business, and as I grew older I wanted his business to succeed. How well I remember the revival meetings we held together! I helped him draw charts for his sermons. I led the singing, played the organ, or helped him ring the church bell. In the final meeting we held together, I was the evangelist and my father stood by my side with joy and in much prayer. With his help the revival became a great success.

Our Heavenly Father is in business too, and as His children

we want it to succeed. So we pray, "Thy kingdome come."
"Thy will be done." Not every son has learned to say,
"Dad, there's nothing I'd rather do than to obey you, to work with you, to try to please you." But happy is the boy who has

a father he can admire and safely follow.

Happy too is the father who has the confidence of a manly, obedient son. As he sees his son grow in skill and understanding and feels his loyalty, he finally does what the Heavenly Father did: he places the family business into his son's hands with full confidence. "The Father loveth the Son, and hath given all things into his hand" (John 3:35).

No earthly father can ever be perfect, but every dad has the privilege of living in such a way as to draw for his

children a rough portrait of the Father in heaven.

Remember, Dad, how the Lord Jesus saw in one like you a picture that reminded Him of God. May your sons and daughters be able to see God in you. May that picture become more clear each day so that when your children pray, they may confidently say, "Our Father which art in heaven!

Cults are False Prophets Cult Characteristics Continued

Doctrinal Ambiguity

There are increasing multitudes of people living in our generation to whom "uncertain sounds" seem beautiful music. To them uncertainty is a form of certainty and ambiquity satisfies the mind more than anything specific. These types, then, are attracted to the ambiguous doctrines of cult religions. Doctrinal ambiguity is a mark of a cult. Their doctrines are being continually altered in order to adapt themselves to new situations, arguments, or the whims of their leaders. Changing doctrine is a cunning device used by those who prey upon the unwary.

A good example is the yearly update of Mary Baker Eddy's book CHRISTIAN SCIENCE FOUNDER ... done so the contradictions and doctrines could be corrected. "Science and

Health With Key to the Scriptures."

When Guru Maharaj was asked what part saying "mantra" plays in meditation his answer was "nothing"...it just makes your tongue in gear...that's all. "Chanting is an external thing."

To a rational mind there is no sense in these expressions or activities. Yet for the cults the word "doctrine" has no meaning for doctrine means a systematic presentation and

understanding of faith.

By contrast what passes for doctrine in the cult is really a subrational set of disconnected thoughts and practices that only serve to confuse the mind and the emotion as well. EMOTIONS were NEVER intended to be an end in themselves and are totally untrustworthy as the custodians of truth. Any religion, therefore, that deliberately bypasses rational doctrinal understanding and seeks to build upon the emotions will inevitably deceive rather than enlighten.

The use of CHANTS, RAISING OF HANDS along with the CLANGING OF CYMBALS, the sing-song REPETITION of simply musical structures, the repeated, staccato AR-TICULATION OF ANY WORD ... all these are subrational and simply calculated to play on the limited strings of the emotional structure-creating what passes as a religious experience but is nothing more than a mindless emotional trauma. Christ told us NOT to use vain repetitions-that we are NOT heard because of our much speaking.

The Krishnas are big on chanting. To chant "Hare Krsna" is to deliver the mind from all unwanted thoughts. They explain that their leader "has mercifully given the chanting of Hare Krsna to the world so that everyone may regain his original joyful consciousness and live in peace and happiness. By chanting these holy names, we reestablish our lost

link with the Supreme and enjoy our real life."

The CULT PROMOTORS are NOT truly appealing to the mind but rather are ATTEMPTING TO SET THE MIND ASIDE and to APPEAL TO A SET OF RELIGIOUS EMOTIONS. Devotees say, "Forget what he is saying, can't you FEEL the vibrations?" Converts are NOT urged to understand, rather it's recommended that they FEEL. Their favorite terms are "self-realization, love, peace, joy."

Christ warned us to be careful of the proper use of words for by them we will be justified or condemned. Matt. 12:37. The Word of God is therefore, very careful to avoid ambiquity. Scripture is very clear with details to make sure there is NO ambiquity-lists cities, villages, rivers, dates, times, kings, and exact quotes. Therefore, the Bible is a book of CAREFUL HISTORIC DETAIL AND DATA. Written clearly, the Bible leaves NO doubt. II Tim. 3:10.

Clarity of belief is then one of the characteristics of true Christianity. John 8:12. The Christian who studies the Word of God becomes spiritually mature, a defender of the faith,

and able even to teach others.

Those WHO FOLLOW CULTS often have NOT wanted the sound doctrine of Christ. II Tim. 4:3,4. Cults raise questions but never answer them, and if you listen carefully, you can't be sure what they are trying to say. They plan it so. Being confused themselves, they are able only to throw dust in the air so that it gets in the eyes of others.

You can't understand what a Jehovah's Witness believes about God, biblical inspiration, eternity, and many other sub-

ARMSTRONG'S attempt to define the nature of the

Godhead is a study in obfuscation.

The UNITY PEOPLE suggest that since God sees and understands perfectly and sees NO evil because there is no evil. we shall see clearly the unreality and futility of appearances of evil to which, through a misunderstanding, man now attributes substance and reality.

Cults tend TO MOVE AWAY FROM SCRIPTURAL TRUTH and to HIDE BEHIND philosophic disscussion. To

them the process of discussion is itself truth.

Christ cut out meaningless word play with the Samaritian woman, Nicodemus, and others. Christ wants the gospel GIVEN IN A STRAIGHT FORWARD MANNER...NOT in tantalizing sentences that never quite get to the point. AM-BIQUITY IS THE DEVILS'S GOSPEL...whereas CLARITY IS DIVINE.

Claim of Special Discoveries

The most fascinating person is one who claims to have IN-SIDE INFORMATION on a given subject. Everyone loves to hear a good story-teller tell of personal experience of a dive, sea trip, etc. But to fall at his feet is something else. Yet this is what cult converts do. Religious fantasies that are presented as special spiritual discoveries are dangerous.

We have "con-artists" in every walk of life that cheat people and that includes the religious world. They claim to have special information. The careful teacher of sound doctrine is rarely as electrifying as the mysterious religious promotor. We're tempted to forget that the best things in life

are NOT ONLY FREE but usually obvious.

There can be NO GREATER PROMISE than that we are blest "with all spiritual blessings in heavenly places in Christ." Eph. 1:3. So, it's amazing to see people follow one who reports some vision, presence, revelation or special discovery when God freely gives such a promise. Yet it would be impossible to have a cult without some mysterious, inside information.

There is NO discovery greater than knowing God personally and to know the abundance of things He has given us...now and in eternity. Yet the cults continue to deceive many with false claims of SPECIAL DISCOVERIES

Foolish Americans and Englishmen-some famous-travel to India to learn the special discoveries of some seedy guru about the secrets of life. Yet for free they could discover the

real secret-Christ.

Scientologists-75,000 in Los Angeles alone-discovered that man has occupied a number of different bodies during his many incarnations in the world and say they can carry an individual back along a "time track" to his earlier lifetimes.

This claim of special discoveries and "repeatable-ondemand revelations from God is the point where cults move into the occult. Witchcraft, spiritism, and Satan worship are nothing more than religions which claim to be able to call for the incursion of the metaphysical in the real of the physical.

Almost universally each cult leader claims divine authority for a private, unauthenticated religious event-a vision, an angel's visit, hear a voice, etc. Any such claim should be subjected to the biblical rules of evidence. Any doctrine is to be built on more than 1 voice or writer...line upon line, precept upon precept. (Isa. 28:9,10). The fundamental

characteristics of the faith of Christ is that it is based on historical fact. True Christianity doesn't depend on some private knowledge or secrets of one person.

But the Bible teaches about false teachers coming. II Peter

2:1-3.

Heresies brought in by false teachers are secret and destructive. Christ didn't even claim such. "If I bear witness of myself, My witness is NOT true." John 5:31.

Peter states "we have not followed cunningly devised fables. II Peter 1:16 God gave instructions to Prophets to write the vision He gave (Habakkuk and John the Revelator,

Daniel)...each supports the other.

Cults attack Christ as deity—Son of God. Any message that denies the Virgin Birth of Christ, holding Him to be merely the natural Son of Joseph and Mary, is a cult. Close behind will be the denial of the trinity of the Godhead.

When a group develops a theological or doctrinal interpretation that touches only minimally on the proper biblical emphasis and lives for the most part outside of that circle, it becomes a cult. As such, it has moved away from the teaching of the Word of God so that its central emphasis

has become a set of human philosophies, ideas, or revelations that can no longer be justified by the teaching of the Word of God. They isolate a segment of scripture to build or substantiate their idea.

Christianity is a belief on ALL scripture. II Tim. 3:16,17. God presented His Truth in an orderly fashion and we build

from single truths to the meat of the word.

The biblical interpreter must ask.

1. What does this verse mean?

2. In what setting is it given to us?

3. How does it relate to the whole bible? A major deficiency of the present day cults is that they neglected to base their faith on the Bible as a whole. Example:

A. One group denies immortality of the soul because of a statement about death in Ecc. 9:5.

B. The Way denies the Trinity because of an undue em-

phasis on the personality of Jesus.

C. The Transcendental Meditation people read verses in the Bible which tell us to think and meditate...the rest they get from a guru.
