
President's Message:

151st ANNUAL MEMORIAL DAY CEREMONY—May 27 at 2:00-3:00 p.m. - Crown Hill presents the longest-



running Memorial Day Ceremony in Indiana! This year marks the 151st annual ceremony, first held on May 30, 1868, shortly after General John A. Logan, Commander-in-Chief of the Grand Army of the Republic, established this day to honor the soldiers and sailors who died during the Civil War. With nearly 10,000 people in attendance, our first ceremony was held on the grounds of the Crown Hill National Cemetery, located behind the historic Gothic Chapel. Our first ceremony featured many speeches, including from by Gov. Conrad Baker, a veteran and former commander of an Indiana Infantry Regiment. The graves of the soldiers in the National Cemetery were decorated with fresh-cut flowers.

- We welcome **Brigadier General J. Stewart Goodwin** (Ret.) USAF, as our keynote speaker (pictured). General Goodwin is the Executive Director of the Indiana War Memorials Commission in Indianapolis, which includes a museum and 25 acres of parks, monuments, sculp-

tures, statues, and fountains. Other guests include **Rodney Strong**, Department Commander for the Indiana American Legion, and **Abraham Lincoln**, the Civil War President, reciting the Gettysburg Address during the ceremony. (**Please come early and visit with President Lincoln inside the Gothic Chapel from 12:15-1:15 p.m.** *Pres. Lincoln is portrayed by Danny Russel*.) - We welcome back the support of the men and women of the **Indiana Army National Guard** as they join us again as they have for many years. In addition to the band concert by the 38th Division Band at 1:30 p.m., a Howitzer 21-gun salute will be conducted by the Indiana Army National Guard. Patriotic music provided by throughout the ceremony by "**The Central Sound**," a Lawrence Central High School choir. Folding chairs will be available or feel free to bring your own chair or blanket. Cookies and bottled water will also be available, as well as indoor restrooms. You're welcome to arrive early or stay late to picnic. (The funeral home and cemetery office closes at 5 p.m. but the gates will remain open until 8:00 p.m.)
