OFFICER AND DIRECTOR REPORTS

PRESIDENT - Ann Parks

As Oaks Royal 3 moves into a new year, I encourage you to attend the important January HOA Members Meeting on the 3rd at 7pm in the Clubhouse. Three board positions are up for election and there will be a vote on a very important bylaw. This is your HOA. Please come out, hear information direct, participate in your community and make your own informed decisions.

In addition, I thought folks would be interested on Road update. There is also a very good video in this same article that explains the new "diverging diamond" road patterns at SR 56 and I-75, where the road is crossing left to right and back again. The link to the full article is at the end.

"The third major Pasco job is the widening of State Road 54 for 4.2 miles from Curley Road to Morris Bridge Road. The bonding company is finalizing a contract with Cone & Graham. That stalled for awhile as that company tried to tie the state work to a Pasco County road project. The price tag for the 54 project is \$42.5 million and the construction started in late 2017.

Gwynn said that he recently put the company on notice that they were not working quickly enough and could face additional financial damages because of delays in the project. Since then, he said he has been assured that work on 54 will begin again this week. Gwynn told members of the Pasco County Metropolitan Planning Organization this month. It became obvious what was written in our declarations regarding us being a 55+ Community had flaws which would make it difficult for the Board to refuse requests for anyone living here permanently between the ages of 23 and 55. Restrictions for visitors between these ages also needed to be addressed. The Board will have the authority to carefully consider requests outside any restrictions.

You will be receiving these proposed changes soon along with a ballot and further explanation of support. Please carefully read and consider them to make our governing documents stronger to keep us a 55+ community.

Voting will occur at our annual HOA January meeting. The positions open are Vice President, Grounds Director and Pool/Spa Director. Those names on the ballot will be Mark St. Pierre, Harry Whittaker and Paul Grizenko. The ballot was closed at out December meeting, but nominations will be allowed from the floor of our January meeting. We look forward to a good turnout at this meeting.

My term as your Vice President will end with the election in January. It has been an honor to serve as your Vice President these past 3 years. I've enjoyed getting to know more of you as residents and work with such a fantastic group of devoted people working hard for you on our Board of Directors. Together we work hard to address issues, carefully consider decisions, act quickly when needed. This group of your neighbors works well together and, with the leadership of our President Ann Parks, decisions made every day are done with you and your investment in this community in mind. They deserve the support of everyone here. They would also welcome a verbal "thank you" now and then!!

All women in OR3 are welcomed to join us.



JANUARY FESTIVALS & FAIRS

Traditionally, the months of January kicks off festival and fair season in Florida. While most of the rest of the nation huddled in their homes and freezes their collective tushies off; those of us lucky enough (or smart enough) to be living in the sunshine state will be basking in 60-70 degree temps and getting out to the many parks or attractions that Florida boasts. After two years of pandemic enforced closures, our festivals and fairs are returning as indeed the nation saw them beginning to return this past summer and fall. So get out and enjoy!

Remember, even if there is no mask mandate at events in Florida, many individuals may, and do, exercise their right to mask themselves if they prefer, regardless of vaccination status.

<u>Jensen Beach Fine Arts and Crafts Show</u>, Jensen Beach, Jan. 8-9, 2022

This free event kicks off the festival season in January with a show that features 125 artists selected by a jury out of hundreds of applicants. The setting is the charming historic streets of Jensen Beach.

Crystal River Manatee Festival, Crystal River, Jan. 15-16, 2022

Orange City Blue Spring Manatee Festival, Orange City, Jan 22-23, 2022

These manatee festivals are each located near a site where hundreds of manatees gather each winter. Both locations offer a variety of activities, including opportunities to view manatees. Florida Rambler story on two <u>January manatee festivals</u>

Fellsmere Frog Leg Festival, Fellsmere, Jan. 20-23, 2022 This funky festival has been happening for 20 years. Food choices start with one frog leg (a frog "pop" on a stick for \$3) up to a gatortail and frog leg dinner for \$14. Music, games, down-home goods.

<u>Children's Gasparilla Extravaganza</u>, Tampa, Jan. 22, 2022 Kickoff of Gasparilla Days, featuring a children's parade along Bayshore Boulevard and "piratechnic" sea battle commemorating the imaginary invasion of Tampa, which is reenacted next weekend. Family-friendly and alcohol-free.

<u>Images – A Festival of the Arts</u>, New Smyrna Beach, Jan. 28-30, 2022

Images presents more than 200 artists from across North America in a waterfront setting. It's a free festival that attracts 45,000.

Homestead Rodeo, Homestead, Jan. 28-30, 2022

Florida has a rich history of rodeos in its small towns. One of the longest lasting traditional rodeos (70+ years) and the southernmost rodeo in the United States is in Homestead.

Gasparilla Pirate Fest, Tampa, Jan. 29, 2022

Colorful, fully-rigged pirate ship Jose Gasparilla magically appears at the south end of Hillsborough Bay, where the invading Ye Mystic Krewe of Gasparilla are met by a flotilla of pleasure craft. The mock sea battle is followed by a Mardi Gra-like parade.

Kumquat Festival, Dade City, Jan. 29, 2022

The historic downtown in Dade City fills with as many as 35,000 people for this free event celebrating the tangy little fruit grown locally. Along with dozens of booths and live entertainment, a highlight is tasting kumquat treats, from kumquat pie to kumquat cookies to kumquat salsa. Free shuttles run from two satellite parking areas —the Pasco County Fairgrounds on State Road 52 and next to Jarrett Ford on US Hwy 301 Truck Route. On the preceding Thursday and Friday, the kumquat growers open their groves and packing houses for tours.
