We are all saying, "2016?!?", where did 2015 go?" But, here we are, January of a new year, and a very important one in all of our lives. We are already inundated with Republican candidate's messages and debates.

January 12: Ruth Weiss, San Diego County Coordinator Election Integrity Project, an independent, non-partisan citizen organization whose mission is to advocate for fair and honest California elections. In addition to researching the state's compliance with state and federal election laws, EIP's activities include recruiting, training and deploying poll observers. The Election Integrity Project believes in the foundational principle that our government is Of the People, By the People, and For the People. This means that citizens must be involved in every aspect of our government, including, or especially, the elections process.

The Election Integrity Project gives concerned voters a strong organization through which to fulfill their civic privilege to be a part of overseeing the elections in California. Ruth is going to give us insight into this important organization, and provide a list of how we can help.

Lori Steele Contorer travels extensively helping others to understand *Security and Audibility in Elections*. She is the world's top expert in election modernization, pioneering the adoption of software as a service and bringing state of the art technologies to make elections more accessible, affordable, transparent, and secure. The transformation has begun, and her visionary leadership in business, innovation and elections led to Ms. Steele Contorer being named in 2013 to Fortune Magazine's 10 Most Powerful Women Entrepreneurs List, a winner of San Diego Business Journal's Women Who Mean Business Award and her induction into the Bowling Green State University Dallas Hamilton Entrepreneur's Hall of Fame.

Since founding Everyone Counts she has led successful election administration and voting projects in countries including the United States, Canada, the United Kingdom, Bosnia & Herzegovina, and Australia, serving voters located in over 165 countries, as well as for the transition from vote by mail to secure online voting for the iconic Oscar and Emmy awards. With her election modernization expertise and insight, Lori Steele Contorer is frequently called on by legislators from around the world, and the media, including Time, the Wall Street Journal, CNN, Fox, MSNBC, Politico and The New York Times. Lori will assist us in understanding the challenges our country faces as technology outpaces the current system. She will discuss the advantages of using technology to ensure accurate elections.

February 9: James Lacy, a former member of the Reagan Administration, political consultant, attorney, and author of *Taxifornia*, will explain how one party domination, environmental lobbyists, and other special interest groups have wreaked havoc on the economy of what was once the greatest state in the union.

March 8: Our speakers for March have changed. Stay tuned for further information.

April 22: Navajo Canyon is hosting a **Political Forum** at **St. Dunstan's Episcopal Church** for the candidates running for office. It is shaping up to be a very interesting and informative evening. This event will be separate from our monthly luncheon/meeting date.

Starting in February, I will be organizing a 'Navajo Trolley Team' to make access, travel and parking easy for everyone. Details will be in next month's newsletter.






