



MAUNDY THURSDAY (April 1)

We gather at Ben Butterworth Park East Pavilion for a time of reflection, song, and Holy Communion at our Tenebrae Service. Please bring your own chairs. If you would like to bring a picnic dinner, please come at 5:00. If you choose not to come early with your dinner, please arrive by 6:00 in order to participate in Holy Communion. Please dress warmly! Blankets are encouraged! Sunset is at 7:38 P.M. and we plan to be finished before evening darkness settles in. Covid safety guidelines will be in place.

Spend some time in quiet contemplative prayer and reflection with self-guided Stations of the Cross in the sanctuary and a labyrinth walk in Fellowship Hall. Reservations will be required in order to ensure safe social distancing requirements are maintained. Spaces are available from 9:00 a.m.-7:00 p.m. Please call or email the church office to reserve a space or if you have any questions.

EASTER SUNDAY (April 4)

6:30 A.M. Sunrise Service: Join us in the Memorial Garden for a special time to celebrate Christ's [resurrection as we watch the sun come up! Dress warmly! Holy Communion will be celebrated: we will have individual communion elements available but you are welcome to bring your own if you are more comfortable doing so.

10:00 A.M. Celebration Service: Our festival service celebrating Christ's resurrection will take place in our sanctuary and will be livestreamed as we regather in person for this service. Following safety guidelines, the maximum number of in person attendees is limited to 50 so reservations will be required. Please email or call the church office to reserve your spot.

Hope UCC Covid Update

We have been carefully following the latest updates in positivity rates, hospitalizations, and vaccination rates. Thankfully, there has been a decrease in the positivity rates and an increase in vaccinations and their availability. What an immense relief to see this happening. After careful consideration and discussion, Hope UCC's Church Council approved the Covid Task Force's plan for regathering in person for worship. This means that worship is going to look and feel different than it did before the pandemic. Here's what you need to know:

- As long as it is safe to do so, we can have up to 50 people at a time, in the building for worship. This number includes everyone: children, adults, staff, and support staff.
- We will require weekly reservations for worship in order to ensure we have space available.
- We will continue to require proper masking (nose and mouth covered) and safe distancing for all church activities, indoors and outside.
- For safety, there is no congregational singing during worship in the sanctuary. We will enjoy the music worship gifts of our music ministry and soloists who will offer this part of worship.
- Doors will open 15 minutes before the service starts and greeters will sign you in. We are doing this to ensure we have the information we need for contact tracing purposes. There will not be any coffee or fellowship hour following worship. We hope to be able to start this once again, maybe outside, when it is safe to do so and weather permits.
- Seating in the sanctuary is spaced so there is 6 feet separating seats. We are utilizing Fellowship Hall for seating as well to ensure the maximum allowable safe number to gather.
- Church Council will evaluate how things are going with our regathering plan after the first month and will then determine other ways to gradually continue to reopen and regather in the building.
- This is very important: As we have discovered during the pandemic, plans can change very quickly! We can only continue to move forward with regathering plans if our county, state, and federal health agencies approve it. If numbers of positive cases and hospitalizations increase again, we will have to adjust accordingly, which may mean pausing our plans for in person worship again. But, fear not, we can pivot and adjust and wait patiently for the next opportunity to regather. The best way to ensure our continued ability to regather is to keep wearing your masks, get your vaccination, and encourage others to do so.

Thank you for your faithful care for yourselves and others during this pandemic. We thank our Covid Task Force and our Church Council for their loving stewardship of this process. We will continue to keep you updated on changes and information.
