Increasing Capacity to Mobilize and Apply Research Knowledge in the Ontario Education System

The study convenes multi-stakeholder panels of researchers, policymakers and practitioners to a) determine three focus areas for KMb efforts (such as mental health, special education, equity or strategic planning), b) suggest existing research-based products, and c) create tailored KMb tools and resources for different educational practitioners in these focus areas. After the focus areas are determined, existing resources in these areas will be aggregated by conducting systematic searches online to find and catalogue existing research-based resources. Resources will be disseminated using existing networks, training and institutional levers to widely distribute the KMb tools and resources to educational practitioners (teachers, vice-principals and principals, superintendents and directors of education). Ultimately, this project will provide a suite of KMb tools and resources to help educators apply research knowledge to improve student outcomes.

A Comparison of Research Impact Frameworks Across OECD countries This study (funded by my \$10,000 research initiation grant) identifies research impact resources that exist in OECD countries across three public service sectors (Education, Health, and Child Welfare) using systematic search protocol. So far, searches of Canada, the USA and the UK have elicited 467 research impact resources ranging from journal articles, to frameworks, to surveys used by universities to measure their work. The second phase of the study will conduct in-depth content analysis of a smaller sub-set of resources that target the education sector specifically (what methodologies are being used, which indicators and metrics and so on).
