Principal Update

Mrs. Lindsay Slover introduced herself and her team of Jennifer Waldron – Assistant Principal and Amanda Rand- Dean of Students. She spoke about the new Mission Vision of Copper Ridge which is "Copper Ridge to College." She spoke about some of the ways the staff is supporting the Mission by creating Data Rooms where teachers can review data and creating Data Folders to keep track of student's data. There is going to be a Curriculum Committee that will meet once a month to make sure goals are being met, and a Key Communication Committee to make sure information is being communicated. There are also two Intervention Teams, Academic Interventions and Behavior Interventions, that are being created to assist in those areas.

There is a Safety Committee that is ensuring the safety of Copper Ridge. The Director of Safety for the district will be visiting Copper Ridge soon to observe the drop off and pick up of students.

There are two forums with Dr. Birdwell coming up. One is a Parent and Community Forum on September 25th at 9:00 am at Chaparral High School and the other is a Learning Community Update on October 25th at 5:30 pm at Chaparral High School. You can find information for these on Peachiar.

Mrs. Slover stated that we have had great support for closing our playground in the mornings. She stated that there are 2 new duty positions of someone walking the sidewalk from the drop off area to the playground and one on the field.

She stated that we will be looking for a way to get U-Turns at drop-off to stop as it is unsafe. Mrs. Slover spoke briefly on a glitch in our computer system Synergy with quarters versus trimesters. She will notify parents when more information is available.

Mrs. Slover spoke about the elective options for students since there is currently no Middle School Spanish Teacher. She stated that parents should watch for more information coming on this topic.

Mrs. Slover is interviewing aides for lower grades and is in need of more applicants to fill positions.
