Bylaws of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, Inc.

ARTICLE VII

It is recognized that the true church of Jesus Christ consists of all believers in the saving grace of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ who have accepted him as their personal Saviour. It is recognized and agreed that no organization or man has been granted authority by the Lord to exclude from or accept anyone into the Kingdom of Heaven, as this is done by Jesus Christ only. It is further recognized and agreed that we as Christians are to love all members of the Body of Christ (Christians), and this love and fellowship derives from the unity instilled by the Holy Spirit. Although differences in doctrinal beliefs and interpretations should not influence our love for one another, adherence to similar doctrinal beliefs and modes of worship have bonded together those of the Apostolic Faith Movement as founded by Charles F. Parham in the early 1900's. The scripture teaches us to adhere to the truth and proper doctrine. These common doctrinal beliefs are essentially as follows:

Triune God; Father, Son and Holy Spirit

Creation and Formation

Man is basically sinful and in need of Salvation

Salvation by Grace upon repentance toward God and acceptance of Jesus Christ as one's personal Saviour, which is the conception of Spiritual Life.

Sanctification of the Spirit, Soul and Body. A second definite work of Grace by the Lord Jesus Christ.

Baptism of the Holy Spirit; evidenced by speaking in other languages.

Water Baptism (of all believers) by immersion in water in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

Washing of Feet.

Divine Healing through Jesus Christ for all believers.
Do not condone divorce and remarriage. Matthew 19:8-9
Destruction of the Wicked.

Conditional Immortality.

Rapture of the Man Child Class.

Return of Jesus Christ to earth again; bodily and visibly.

A Ministry supported by tithes and offerings.

These basic doctrines shall be adhered to in the teaching of the Apostolic Faith Bible College, which in addition to other doctrinal teachings approved by the Board from time to time if they are not inconsistent with the above listed basic doctrines.

The Peace of God

We can be at peace with our neighbors in the natural, but should they do something against us, it takes the Peace that God gives for us to act in Love toward them. If we do not find that Peace within us, then we need to search our heart and soul and see if by chance there may be deep hurt, anger...malice etc within.

How do we obtain this Peace of God? That wholeness in

Him? It does not come all in a moments time, it is a process.

Isa. 9:6 tells us that Jesus is the Prince of Peace, He is our Wonderful Counseler, He is our Mighty God, The Everlasting Father. We must follow the instructions of our Lord, for He is our deliverer.

Let us talk about the wars within, for there is a struggle between the spirit and soul. You can read what Paul says about it in Romans 7. Our soul (mind) is what controls this

What I am saying is...the flesh is controlled, for the most part, by the mind rather than the spirit. After Christ comes into our hearts, He wants to guide us and help us to put on His nature. We find in Gal. 5:19-21 some of the...works of the flesh: adultery, fornication, uncleaness, lasciviousness, idolatry, witchcraft, hatred, variance, emulations, wrath, strife, seditions, heresies, envyings, murders, drunkenness, revellings and such like. If we are practicing these...in our lives we cannot enter that first fruit Kingdom of God realm. Fullness in Him is Peace.

This Peace of God does not come all at once. The Lord may show us through a testing that if we lean on him, He will cleanse us from our evil thoughts and give us Love and Peace. If we keep that Peace we have, it will be easy for us to go through the next testing with victory. This will cause us to develop a Love that makes us Love our enemies, to bless them that curse us, do good to them that hate us, and pray for them which despitefully use us. Matt 5:44

While meditating on a testing of a brother and sister one day the Lord spoke to my spirit and told me there was Bread in the valley. In other words this brother and sister in Christ would receive bread, which is spiritual food, in this testing.

This was Peace to me.

Then we go to the 20th and 21st verses. "For our citizenship is in heaven, from which also we eagerly wait for our Saviolur, the Lord Jesus Christ, who will transform the body of our humble state into conformity with the body of His Glory, by the exertion of the power He has even to subject all things to Himself." New American Standard Version. If our goal in life is to be transformed into His glorious Body, then the rubbish within us which wars against the spirit, will have to go, to have that Peace that passes all understanding. Be blessed and read Phil. 3rd Chpt.

I WILL NOT LEAVE YOU NOR FORSAKE YOU"

In Deuteronomy 31:6,8..God comforts Israel at a time when Moses was drawing near his death, telling the nation that God, Himself, will cross the Jordon before them, and destroy the nations there, that they might posses the Land.

Knowing the struggle before them, God encourages them by these words, spoken through Moses, saying..."I will not leave you nor forsake You." These very words are a comfort to us today, knowing that God is near us, even in our heart..

In the Gospel of John 14:15-18.. Jesus is quoted by saying,

"If you love Me, keep My commandments, And I will pray the Father, and He will give you another Comforter, that He may abide with you forever.. Even the Spirit of Truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees Hom nor knows Him; but you know Him, for He dwells with you and will be in you...I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you.

God has always been close to those in need, comforting them In His Love, with good reason.. It's called loneliness.

As we look into the gaze of a young child, his eyes coated with a thin layer of tears, empty and alone, we can begin to cry with such a child, feeling his very heart's beat, not able to understand all that is happening around him. All that he knows is he is hurting inside, a throb that comes from deep within. In pain, emotions only are shown through a look that can pierce the very heart of God.

This is a picture of a child that is left alone. Silenced by the fact that many such young children today face a life without

the love due them.

Orphans of a sort, through broken homes, and institutions ranging from correctional to shelters, created for the protection of abused or battered children. Even mentioning those who never know father or mother, put in a place hoping someday someone will care enough to open a child's heart. accepting them as one of their own.

It's sad to find such children in a place they have little or no control over. Born into a world only to find it being one of disappointment and hardship, not to have opportunity to know what it really is to be loved, cherished, and wanted, in

an environment that speaks different.

Many have never known the touch of a mother or the smile from Dad. Their ability to respond to such love is limited, creating a void in their heart, a silent and empty cry, only caring to be loved and not left alone

The same can be said for the aged, being shut out many times for reasons being, too old, or not able to care for themselves in a way without it interfering in the lives of their loved ones. These often times find themselves surrounded by the thing they feared the most-being left alone.

The heart's cry is not one of living in an institution or nursing home as much as it is for lack of genunine com-

panionship.

Even those who are at home and still able to get around, so often times are left with an empty house, void of those who mean the most to them. Sitting at their kitchen table, their eyes washed with the tears which flow from their cheaks, blaming themselves for something they really have no control over. Their heart beating irregularly, hoping to end their life in sorrow so that ours can go on.

A life of empty feelings, convinced that without them

things could be better.

Again we have a picture of an orphan, abandand by their very thoughts of value and worth, becoming something less than a nuisance, or bother. Again we hear from their heart the same silent and empty cry to be loved and not left alone.

You see, loneliness effects everyone. Even to those who are considered middle aged or in the prime years of their life. It is these too that are left many times in an empty room surrounded by memories that only add to their plight. A condition that creates the state of loneliness, empty and solitude, without the company of those who should mean so much, only to care so little. Their heart's throb is one of lack, sad and left alone to work out for themselves something many times their is no strength left in them to fight, for who they are, and for what they are. Many tears come through their eyes, being the only fluid of life in emotions that say I'm still alive, yet adding to their wish of death, fearing that if life as they know it now, continues, will be one of heart break and anguish. Being crushed by the very by the very thought of loneliness, without husband or family, and even friends, they lose hope.

The teenager is not exempt either. In fact many times the teenager faces what they call a generation gap. Thinking that no one cares or can understand what goes on in the heart of an individual that is no longer considered a child, yet not old

enough to be an adult.

These many times face walls of empty emotions, wanting to be loved yet surrounding themselves in a cell, which will not let anyone come in or go out. Their stare is one in need to be loved and understood, despite the differences, hoping that the ones they care for the most will enter the room with a loving arm, surrounding them not with mere words, but a caress which says, We Love You..

We Love You...Words that mean so much to all of us that have faced times as these. Words that made the difference

when nothing else could.

It is an expression of thought, created in the heart, from the very throne of God. It is the cure, through actions shown, that give hope to all of us. Being the key to freedom from moments which question our existance. It is the very life of God, entering into an individual, in his or her deepest and darkest hour of need, comforting the soul, hearing the still small voice, "I Love You'

In the gospel of John, it was Jesus who said, "I came so that you might have life, and that more abundantly." It is this same Jesus whose sacrifice released the comforter, knowing that without Him our lives are all but hollow, left

totally alone.

It is this comforter that fills our heart with hope, and a purpose to go on in life, knowing that He will never leave us or forsake us. Yes, this is the God whom we serve...and it is this Jesus who's compassion is shown with His arms outstretched still, to a people in need, to a people that cannot exist without the touch of God. allowed to continue, will totally destroy an individual. Thir-


sting for companionship, they die.

Cults Are False Prophets

JEHOVAH'S WITNESSES

Jehovah's Witnesses are, by their own definition, "servants of Jehovah, the Almighty God and active witnesses to his sovereign supremacy." They reject any association with the religious hypocrites of organized Christendom. Anti-Christ is defined as any organization or individual that is against Christ or Christianity. This includes those who say that Christ was God incarnate; deny Christ actually came to earth as a Perfect Man of Flesh; The Collective Clergy of Christendom; pagan Religions; Communistic Red Religion, and supporters of the United Nation.

God's sovereignty, they say, was impugned when Adam and Eve rebelled. Therefore, the major issue before all heaven and earth is the vindication of the name and sovereignty of Jehovah. This is more important than the salvation of men, and will be completely settled at the coming Battle of Armageddon. The faithful members of this organization are demonstrating that there is a group of persons dedicated to do God's will and thus are vindicating his

reproached and misrepresented name.

Their endless production of books are all written in an authoritative tone, very convincing to uninformed readers. They teach strongly against the Trinity doctrine. The essential deity of Jesus Christ is denied as well as the personality

of the Holy Spirit.

The efficacy of the atonement is vitiated by the demand for continued faithfulness in witnessing, and any degree of assurance of salvation is virtually impossible. There is unscriptural stress on the 144,000 followers of Christ who only will go to heaven. The mass of the Jehovah's Witnesses work incessantly with the hope of eternity on an earthly paradise and continuance even there seems contingent upon faithfulness

This organization was legally incorporated in 1884 by Charles Taze Russell. It was then known as The Watch Tower Bible and Tract Society. Nicknames heard for the organization are Russellites, Millennial Dawnist, and Rutherfordites (after Russell's successor). In 1931 the official name became Jehovah's Witnesses based on Isaiah 43:10 and 44:8.

Sources of Authority

"Let God have the say as to what is the truth that sets men free". "Accept His Word, the Bible, as the truth." By these and other similar statements the group purposes to reveal their devotion to the Bible. It is Jehovah's, God's written word to mankind, revealing himself and expressing his purpose.

Actually the ultimate source of authority is the Word of God is translated and interpreted in voluminous writtings of the organization. Pastor Russell stated that people CANNOT see the divine plan by studying the Bible itself. "Be it known that no other system of theology even claims or has ever attempted to harmonize in itself every statement of the Bible, yet nothing short of this can we claim." it is titled The New World Translation of the Holy Scriptures and the title page states that the translation is rendered from the Original Languages. It is a biased translation made to verify predetermined doctrines. Many of the peculiar teachings of the Watchtower Society are smuggled into the text of the Bible itself. Unwarranted liberties are taken in the English translation to substantiate teaching which is not in keeping with that of historic Christianity but is DOGMATICALLY stated in Jehovah's Witness writings.

In the book, Make Sure of All Things, it is categorically declared that the Holy Spirit is NOT a person and again the deity of Christ is denied. John 1:1 is translated, "In the beginning the Word was..and the Word was a god." In Colossians 1:15-17 the word "other" has been inserted without warrant, 4 times. This is done in order to put Jesus on a level with "other" created things. Phil. 2:6 is another false translation; "Christ Jesus) although he was existing in God's form, gave no consideration to a seizure, namely, that he should be equal to God." The obvious meaning is that Christ was not equal with God, and did not choose to be. These examples reveal that the source of authority for Jehovah's Witnesses is not the Bible but the Bible as interpreted by Russell, Rutherford, and their successors. Russell's sanctified common sense rejected the mystery of the Trinity, and with it he eliminated the very person of the Holy Spirit who convicts of sin (John 16:8) and denigrated the deity of the Son, without which there can be no atonement.

Their Doctrine of God

The name Jehovah means "the purposer". he is the only true God, and is now working out his purpose of vindicating his name and sovereignty and blessing all faithful mankind through his kingdom. he is NOT a triune god, which "false doctrine would deny his slmighty supremacy. "The doctrine of the Trinity originated in "ancient Babylonish paganism." (MS 386).

They believe that Jehovah is one person with principal attributes of love, wisdom, justice, and power. At one time all alone the universal space, He was self-contained and never lonely. he is omniscient, but NOT omnipresent although His

power extends everywhere.

The Holy Spirit is NOT a person; rather, He is subject to God and is defined as Jehovah's invisible energizing force..that produces visible results..experienced by men. Gen. 1:2 was translated to read, and God's active force was moving to and fro over the surface of the waters."

Their Doctrive of Creation

Jehovah God created all that exists. he, the great First Cause, brought into existence all that is material and spiritual in the universe. There were 3 stages of creation:

A. The only-begotten Son was the first creation. He was given "priority and preeminence among all God's cretures." By this creation, God became a father. Jesus became the

master workman, the co-worker with Jehovah.

B. Angels, of different ranks, were created next. First Lucifer was created. He and Jesus were the princes and were called morning stars, and worked together and sang together. Then all other spirit sons of God (seraphim, cherubim, and angels were brought forth "perfect, glorious, holy.

C. Finally, the heavens and earth were created. At Jehovah's command Jesus brought the rest into being..the material creation. They believe that each of the Creator's

workdays was 7,000 years.

Their Doctrine of Jesus Christ

Jesus is a created individual and is the second greatest personage of the universe. Jehovah God and Jesus together constitute the Superior Authorities. They vehemently deny the deity of Christ and say that is an ancient heresy known as Arianism. Jesus was a Jew whose life and teachings have affected the course of all human history. He was one who had a wonderful past before he appeared on earth and was known as Michael, the archangel. The following are written in Make

Sure of All Things.

A. First-born Son of God, a spirit..the most loved and favored. He was the Word, or the Logos and so was a god but does not possess immortality or deathlessness.

B. lesser than Jehovah. Refer back to their translation of Phil. 2:6. He did not follow Satan or plot and scheme to make

homself like or equal to the Most High God.

C. Born as a human Son of God. Oct. 2 B.C. At the time the young woman conceived by the miracle-working power of Jehovah and then the life of the Son of God was transferred from heaven to the embryo of a human. To call this an "incarnation of God" is unscriptural for the Son of God laid aside completely his spirit existence. He was born as a mere human creature.

D. Became the Messiah Seed, in fall A.D. 29. By his water baptism, Jesus indicated his submission to do God's will. God thereupon consecrated Him by His holy spirit and acknowledged Him as His beloved Son. Jesus was anointed to be the long-promised King in God's kingdom..and to be the

Messiah.

E. Died on Stake as Ransomer in springs, A.D. 33. By definition, the cross is a symbol falsely used to represent Christianity. Jesus was NOT crucified on a cross; rather he

was impaled on a stake. (single upright pole)

F. Resurrected Immortal on 3rd day. Jehovah raised Jesus from the dead, not as a human son, but as a mighty immortal spirit Son. He showed himself for 40 days to his disciples. God raised Him to deathless heavenly life as a glorious spirit creature, next to himself. The materialization of Jesus' body after the resurrection was a temporary thing. But they don't tell us what happened to his physical body but it did NOT decay or corrupt. Since there is no bodily resurrection, there is no 2nd coming.

Their Doctrine of Man

Toward the end of the 6th creative day, (42,000 yrs) God made man in His own image. man was given dominion over the earth and its forms of life, with attributes of wisdom, justice, love, and power.

A. 1. Man is a soul. he is a body together with the life principle or life force activating it. Man has NO soul within him that is separate and distinct from his human body. Death is

simply cessation of existence.

2. Man is not immortal, any more than are fish, birds, etc. All are "earthly souls" having organisms of flesh which are kept living by means of blood circulating in their systems". Man does NOT possess the quality of deathlessness or incorruptibility as this teaching originated by Satan in the Garden. Angels also are mortal and destructible.

3. Immortality is given as a reward for faithfulness to Christ. But it must be noted that ONLY the 144,000 can ever receive immortality. Immortality is inseparably linked with the kingdom of heaven, and flesh and blood creatures cannot enter. Human souls can only dwell forever on the earth.

B. 1. had Adam NOT sinned, he would have lived on earth forever in his mortal state, as would have his children.

- 2. By Adam's disobedience, the sentence of death was passed upon all mankind. Death is called soul-sleep, the "termination of existence, utter cessation of conscious, intellectual or physical activity. in this connection the resurrection of the body is actudally re-creation by God, not restoration.
- 3. When Satan induced man to sin, he atually challenged God. Could Jehovah put on earth a man who could not be turned away from Him. God's sovereignty was impugned, and thus the vindication of His name became an issue before the universe.

Their Doctrine of Salvation

"Salvation is the deliverance from the sin, a redemption

from the ultimate end of sin which is everlasting death, annihilation."

A. The Ransom paid for all. The Fall brought death to all men and the perfect human life with all its rights was lost. But on the cross Christ made atonement for sin which canceled death and gave to man the opportunity to receive the gift of life. The ransom price was Jesus' human life poured out in willing sacrifice. He exchanged his human existence for the spirit existence.

B. The ransom does NOT avail for all. Salvation is a GOAL to be attained by those who faithfully carry out their dedication to do God's will. The people of Noah's day, those who lived in Sodom, the religious hypocrites of Jesus' day, and those who are killed at Armageddon are beyond redemp-

tion

C. Only the 144,000 will share in heavenly glory with Jesus. All other Jehovah's Witnesses will enjoy the blessings of life on the earth. We are told that God had predestinated the "requirements and the qualifications" of this heavenly class before the foundation of the world but didn't reveal it until John wrote Rev. 7:4 and 14:1-3. The 144,000 constitute the Bride, the Lamb's wife. They are the elect, the holy nation, the royal priesthood. They only are anointed with God's spirit, and are members of the body. Designated requirements are:

1. They must exercise faith in God's provision, the shed blood of Christ which includes baptism, symbolizing dedication. The dedicated one is not in position to be justified or declared righteous by God and thus he has access to God through Christ Jesus.

2. God now..causes his active force of holy spirit to act upon them so as to bring them forth as spiritual sons with the hope

of life in heaven.

3. They must "demonstrate their dependability by carrying out their dedication faithfully until death. If they resist Satan and his world and maintain integrity until death, they are assured of the "crown of life" immortality, divine

nature. (Apostles were 1st members of this group)

D. The other sheep are promised everlasting life on earth. These are the unnumbered persons now working as Jehovah's Witnesses. For them there is NO suggestion of justification or regeneration. They must have faith in Jesus, preceded by repentance from sin. They they must be baptized by immersion which symbolizes complete dedication and is a declaration of their stand for God's universal sovereignty. This "baptism into the greater Noah" saves them now, and later it will keep them saved through Armageddon provided..they abide in him, keeping their good conscience through faith and loyal service.

The Jehovah's Witness is NEVER given a clear title to salvation. They must continue in faith, endurance, obedience, witnessing. There are 4 possible destinies when a person

dies:

1. he may remain in the condition of non-existence (as

Adam, Cain, etc.)

- 2. he may be "raised" with a spirit body thus receiving immortality, after which he will go directly to heaven as one of the 144,000.
- 3. he may be raised with a physical body and then after having passed the millennial tests, receive everlasting life on the renewed earth.
- he may, after having been raised with a physical body, still fail to pass the millennial tests and thus eventually be annihilated.

Their Doctrine of Things to Come

It should be noted that the kingdom of God is ENTIRELY HEAVENLY. It is a Sovereign-empowered theocratic government with Jehovah as the great Everlasting King. Christ is

co-regent, with the 144,000 as associate kings.

A. In 1914 the Kingdom began operation in full with the enthronement of Christ in the heavens. In that year Christ received his "never-to-be-destroyed" kingdo. This marked the end of the "appointed times of the nations" and the time of the end of this world began. The following scriptures prove

this theory:

1. Daniel 4:16; 2. Rev. 12:6,14 (A time, times and half a time means 3 and one-half times or half of 7 times, so equals 2,520 days. 3. Numbers 14:34, Ex. 4:6 set God's rule as "A day for a year so 2,520 days means 2520 years. in 607 B.C. Jerusalem was captured by Babylon, to begin the "times of the nations." Proceeding 2,520 years from 607 B.C. brings us to A.D. 1914, the year in which Christ's 2nd coming took place. At that time, the devil and his angels were hurled down to earth and all trouble came, as WW-1.

B. In 1918 2 major events took place:

1. Jesus entered the "spiritual temple, and began to cleanse it." This marked the period of judgment and inspection of his spirit-begotten followers, that is the 144,000 who had died. These are now raised with spiritual bodies and have joined him in the spiritual temple. This is the 1st resurrection.

2. The judgment of the nations began. The people living in the world are being divided into "the sheep and goats" (Matt. 25:31-46) The resurrected members of the 144,000 are associated with Christ as judges. The basis of judgment is the individual attitude toward Jehovah's Witnesses and their

message

C. The Battle of Armageddon is the next great event in history. This battle will be led by Jesus as he leads invisible forces or righteousness to destroy Satan and his demonic and human organization. Organized religion, the great harlot of Rev. 17:1-3 will lead all nations as part of Satan's organization in heaven and earth. The beast of Rev. 17:3 is the United Nations. it was (as the League of Nations) is not (during WW 11) and has ascended (s the U.N.)

Armageddon does NOT mean a literal place. Megiddo is symbolic. Armageddon refers to God's war by which he destroys the world at the accomplished end. Satan will be crushed and cast into the abyss for 1000 years (Rev. 20:1-3) which is a deathlike state of inactivity as Jesus was in when

he died. Thus Genesis 3:15 is fulfilled.

D. Armageddon survivors will enter the Millennium on earth. The new earth, a new human society under new social arrangements) will be governed by the New Heavens (Christ and 144,000). There will be no evil, no disease, nor aches or pains... but lasting peace and unity...one worship of Jehovah. Every faithful human will be a vigorous energetic youth. The Armageddon survivors will marry and have children but when the earth is full people will stop having children.

E. There will be 2 resurrections early in the Millennium. The 1st persons to be raised to life on earth with physical bodies will be Jehovah's faithful witnesses of pre-Christian times. (Enoch, Noah, Abraham, etc.) They will be princes on earth. 2nd resurrection will be those who wanted to do right but died without opportunity to hear or learn..decent...sincere people. They will be taught the truth and judged according to what they do about it.

F. The final test or judgment will come when Satan the devil is loosed. By deceit he will gain a large following and lead a final rebellion against Jehovah. All the rebels with Satan and his demons, will be cast into the lake of fire.

G. The 144,000 having been raised in spirit-bodies, will remain in heaven for eternity. They are "joint-heirs and corulers" with Christ in Jehovah's theocracy. The other sheep will remain on earth, entering upon an eternity of paradisaic happiness. All others will have endless death.

Calvary

Luke 23:33, "And when they were come to the place, which is called Calvary, there they crucified him, and the malefactors, one on the right hand, and the other on the left."

This is also known as: the place of a skull which is called in the Hebrew, Golgotha. John 19:17; Mark 15:22; and Matthew

27:33.

Of all the places on this earth, this spot is the most precious, because it is the starting point up the path to eternal life.

There are several places, on this earth, that are important. Mesopotamia, is believed to be the Garden of Eden, the starting place of the human race by Adam and Eve. Mt. Horeb is where Abraham offered his only son as a sacrifice, only to have his hand stayed by the power of God as he raised the knife. There God showed him the Ram caught in the briar

bush to be sacrificed instead of his only son.

Mt. Sinai is where Moses received the Ten Commandments from God. Jesus was born in Bethlehem, wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger. The borrowed tomb of Joseph of Arimathaea from which Jesus arose from the dead, and the Mount of Olives where Jesus often went to pray, from where He ascended to God after His resurrection, and to which He shall return some day are all important places in biblical history.

And to more modern times every country has special places of meaning, such as sacred shrines where victories were achieved or death brought special sacredness. I'm thinking of Waterloo: Athens; Mecca; The Ganges; Philadelphia; Gettysburg; the Alamo; and Iwo Jima just to

name a few.

In the religious field we remember Luther in Germany, where his ninety-five these were tacked on the door of the Catholic Church and The Bethel Bible College in Topeka, Kansas where the latter rain fell in 1900-1901. This makes us remember the upper room in Jerusalem where the early rain fell on the day of Pentecost. These are special places duly admired.

Each of us have some special places of cherished memories such as our home. mine was in Kansas where Smoots Creed runs into the Ninnescah River. The house and barns are gone but the old cement silo was still standing the last time I was there. While there many wonderful memories came across my mind like soft fluffy clouds passing by on a pleasant balmy day. I'm sure, as I mention these things, your mind is filled with pleasant and a few unpleasant memories. These are places of great importance to Nations, communities, and individuals. I do not wish to cause them to diminish. Keep them; cherish them; and think of them often. This will help to ease the pleaures more enjoyable.

Now add to these places one special spot that God chose: the place of a skull; in the hebrew Golgatha; and known in our language as Calvary. "And when they were come to the place called Calvary." it is not a beaufiful place. In fact it is quite gory. It shows man at his worst in blood-shedding, torture, and mockery, it shows God and Christ at their best in

suffering, compassion, and love.

In spite of all the religious beliefs in the world, God has seen to it that the cross, on Calvary, is known throughout the world. Many have died in honour and some in shame but none are remembered with the same degree of sacredness as Calvary. Whether it is accepted or not, the world knows that Jesus died on the middle cross, falsely accused and wrongfully slain.



To Christiandom Calvary is the sacred shrine of all. Some two thousand years ago, Jesus the divine Son of God, there shed his blood. The earth, long ago, has swallowed those precious drops. They cannot be found. But those drops of blood have forgiven the sin of humans through the years. How can it be.. This boggles the mind of humans yet it is a fact, and we that accept this find peace of mind; beautiful forgiveness of sin; and we start our journey toward heaven, on the straight and narrow path, at Calvary. All who receive eternal life, and rewards of inheritance from Jesus, must start at Calvary. There is no other way. We do not travel there literally but in minds-eye and through faith we start toward heaven at the foot of the old rugged cross. "And when they were come to the place called Calvary." The Saviour will take them and make your life worth something in this life and place in your heart a vibrant hope: a ray of light; that will shine more and more until that day it illuminates in incorruptible or im-

mortal glory. All because of Calvary.
