"Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up."

Paul writes these words to young believers, not necessarily in age, but in their time following Christ. They had laid hold of the Gospel, but there was much that they still needed to learn about what it means to be a disciple of Jesus Christ.

In the previous chapter Paul had been outlining the difference between the fruits of the flesh and the fruits of the Spirit and driving home the point that we reap what we sow in this life. However, for the Galatians who found themselves in the middle of a society that was decidedly living according to the flesh, doing good was exhausting. Not only did the Galatians find them-

selves as outsiders because of their different behavior, but it didn't feel as though they were always "winning." Doing good felt costly to them, and sometimes going back to their old way of life seemed appealing.

As I sit writing I can see the sad state of our apple and pear trees in the backyard. Due to no fault of their own, this year has been absolutely miserable for good fruit. The environment they found themselves in worked against their best efforts in this season.

I wonder if the Galatians felt a bit like those trees: expending energy on doing good, on trying to live according to the Spirit rather than the flesh. I have no doubt they saw some of the fruits of the Spirit in themselves and among their fellow believers, but it must have been discouraging when looking at the pain in the world around them. Even among fellow believers, Paul's letters reveal mistreatment and poor behavior.

It is to these believers who Paul seems to sense are becoming weary, that he offers an encouragement to persevere. He says at the "proper time" we will reap a harvest. Paul is no doubt referring to God's timing here, which is often much different from our timing. We can become impatient so easily, wanting to enjoy the fruits of our labor immediately. However, Paul's encouragement here doesn't promise immediate results, but it does promise reliable results.

I've watched these fruit trees in our yard for enough years to know that so long as they persevere, fruit will come. I have also seen that some years are better than others. As Christians in a rural area, we know all too well how the fruits of our labors can vary -- the same effort can produce wildly different harvests. Our task is not to know when and how the fruit comes, but rather to persevere. We must press on with the conviction that if we "don't give up" doing good as Paul says, the fruit will come.



KICY broadcasts from Nome, Alaska and is owned by Arctic Broadcasting Association, which is a 501(c)3 non-profit, affiliated corporation of the Evangelical Covenant Church. KICY serves native Alaskan villages and the Russian far east. Most of our annual operating budget comes from churches and individual donations.

Since we first signed-on in 1960, KICY has continued to broadcast the good news of Jesus Christ throughout Western Alaska and the Russian Far East. We have increased our power to 50,000 watts, 24 hours a day which allows KICY AM 850 the opportunity to send the gospel into some places where other forms of media are not readily available.



The fourth Sunday of October is the 20h Annual KICY 100% Sunday. This is the one day of the when **KICY** year seeks denomination-wide donations of only \$1.00, but from 100% of those in a Covenant Church on that Sunday morning. This allows everyone throughout the Covenant family to invest in the work of KICY prayerfully and financially. intentional evangelism initiative

Our wider ECC family developed this intentional evangelism initiative remembering that since the time of Abraham, God has blessed his people so that we might bless those who do not know him. Through five simple practices within your spheres of influence—friends, relatives, acquaintances, neighbors and colleagues—the people outside of God's family— we can be a part of their journey toward Christ. Pastor Erik will continue preaching on these 5 practices over the next few weeks.

- **1.** <u>Begin With Prayer</u> Pray for people in your life who are far from God. Ask God, "How do you want to use me to bless the people in my life?"
- **2.** <u>Listen With Care</u> Pay attention to people's dreams and pain. Listen for evidence of God's work in their lives.
- **3.** Eat Together Share meals and life with people in your life who do not know God. Listen for evidence of God's work in their lives.
- **4.** <u>Serve In Love</u> Be attentive to opportunities God provides you to care for people and attend to their needs.
- **5. Share Your Story** Once you build relationship and earn trust, look for ways you can share the story of how Jesus is transforming your life and the world.
