

WILFRED "RAY" SOUVA

1920 - 1993

Former Kindle resident Wilfred "Ray" Souva, 72 of Casenville, passed away Thursday, March 25 at his home, following a long illness.

He was born Aug. 27, 1920 in Meade Township near Kindle, son of the late Joseph and Sarah (Carteau) Souva. He married Mary Frances Gottschalk on Feb. 14, 1941 at St. Dominic's Catholic Church in Detroit. She preceded him in death on June 14, 1974.

He later married Frances (Clancy) Klein on July 4, 1979 at St. Roch Catholic Church, Casenville.

Mr. Souva attended Hagle Rural School. He was a World War II veteran, having served in the Pacific Theater. He was employed by the former Duke Roofing Co. of Bad Axe, Huron County Road Commission and North Huron School District as custodial supervisor, retiring in 1984.
