

The Fishin' Hole

July 15th of 2021, in Washington County along Chartiers Creek, a fungicide spilled into the water. As the stream traversed along its normal path through Washington County and into Allegheny County, it carried the fungicide along killing what the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection estimated to be tens of thousands of fish. For weeks after the spill, you could not look at sections of the stream without seeing Smallmouth Bass, Carp, Catfish and Walleye piling up dead along the banks. It was a very sad time for local anglers.

July 16th of 2022, I made my way onto the stream early that Saturday morning. I went near a spot I remember as being very hard hit by the June 15 kill. In about three hours of fishing that morning, I could not be more delighted to tell you, I caught no fewer than six different species of fish.

Among the fish I caught were four Smallmouth Bass, all very healthy and more than two pounds, several Walleye including the four plus pounder pictured here and a handful of feisty Channel Catfish, one of which I am certain was pushing right up against ten pounds. Yes, one year and one day removed from what seemed like total devastation at the time, I enjoyed one of my most successful fishing excursions on Chartiers Creek ever!

July was a great month on the local rivers as well. At the mouth of Montour Creek where it empties into the back channel of the Ohio River, anglers were having great success with Smallmouth Bass and Walleye during the early morning and early evening hours all month. Night fishing for big Flathead Catfish has been off the charts in that same area. If you want to try this, make sure you do so safely and with the proper equipment.

August 14th, the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission is having a class up on Moraine Lake for beginner kayak fisherman. They have the same class on the 12th and 13th of the month but those classes have completely filled up, so, if you have an interest in kayak fishing, I recommend you register online quickly before the Sunday seats are gone as well. Simply type this into your computer or phone to register, or learn more register-ed.com/ events/view/185033.

The "dog days" of summer are coming so think deep, or fast water for your best fishing experiences.

Include Health and Safety as Part of Your Back-to-School Preparation

Getting ready for a new school year is fun and exciting. As part of the back-to-school routine, adding health and safety to your checklist is a must for children from kindergarten to college.

An annual physical is required for student athletes, but all children should receive a well-check every year to assess health, weight, growth and to stay on track with immunizations. Your doctor will tell you which shots are needed, depending on the

child's age. A vision and hearing check is usually part of an exam. These are important because sometimes learning issues can be attributed to undetected vision or hearing problems. And, it's a good idea to also schedule dental check-ups and cleanings before the start of school.

Check backpacks for strength and back support and be sure to talk to the doctor about the maximum weight for your child's size and health condition. If needed, you may have to alert the school about the number of books and binders your child can haul at school and travelling to and from home.

Make sure your child has the proper safety equipment for sports: helmets, eye protection, shin guards, etc. and fill out the forms from the school to inform administrators and teachers about any of your child's special medical needs. If attending a new school, don't forget to find out about the school's emergency/crisis plan. Also, make sure strangers can't walk into the school unnoticed.


Check to see that the playground is safe - it should be free of peeling paint, rust and sharp edges. The ground should be soft enough to cushion falls.

Remind your children about illness prevention. To avoid exposure to germs, tell them to wash their hands often, and to cover their mouths when coughing and sneezing. And, not to share food or drinks with friends. Consider re-setting your child's sleep schedule to "school time" two weeks before school begins. Children should have at least 8

hours of sleep per night. Enough sleep each night can keep your child health and focused during the school day.

Lastly, good nutrition habits will contribute to your child's success even through to high school and college. Studies prove that a nutritious breakfast helps students excel in school. Students who eat breakfast are more alert during class and the right foods combined with enough rest will help fight off infections, minimizing missed days due to illness.




