PASTOR LEANNE'S MESSAGE...

When I was a kid, science fiction movies always took place after the year 2000. That sounded so far away to me! I imagined that, by 2020, the world would be drastically different than my boomer imagination could stretch—based on popular images of the day, I anticipated: robots that looked like the tin-man would spout knowledge, act as alarm clocks, and anticipate danger (Danger, Will Robinson!). I thought I would see computers the size of entire rooms calculate algorithms for success and failure—dogs that could be walked on tread-mills outside one's space bubble home (ala George Jetson!), cars would fly, kids would go to school via jet-pack and best of all—a roller-skating robot named Rosie would clean my home and have a switch on her back so I could shut her off if I please.

It hasn't quite evolved like that—but still, things I couldn't have imagined then have greatly altered the world of my youth—the internet, social media, cell phones, to name a few...(that room sized computer now fits in my hand!) there are cars that can drive themselves, and drones that deliver packages—it's hard to find a car that starts with a plain old-key, and I am just stubborn enough to want one! All said, I think George Jetson would like it, but I am disappointed that Roomba is the closest I can get to a robot-maid.

For generations before us, change came slow. Now it comes so fast we scarcely have time to adapt. By the time I know the secrets of properly using my I-phone, it is obsolete. If I mention George Jetson to confirmands, it's like I have two heads. The speeding up of time, and the minimalization of space has impacted the human psyche in ways that have yet to be clear.

I don't know what changes this year will require of us, but I do know this...we are up to it. Things may speed on ahead, but so will we—for we are Christ's and he is steady as they come.







NURSE'S NOTES...

Welcome to 2020! I hope each one of you had a great 2019.

On New Year's Eve, Daniel was in no shape to drive, so he sensibly left his van in the parking lot and walked home. As he was wobbling along, he was stopped by a policeman. "What are you doing out here at four o'clock in the morning?" asked the police officer. "I'm on my way to a lecture," he answered. "And who on earth, in their right mind, is going to give a lecture at this time on New Year's Eve?" enquired the Constable sarcastically. "My wife," slurred Daniel grimly.

What Is Advance Care Planning?

CDC's public health activities to prevent and control disease include a substantial focus on chronic disease management. Advance care planning can be a gift you give yourself and your family. It is about doing what you can to ensure that your wishes and preferences are consistent with the health care treatment you might receive if you were unable to speak for yourself or make your own decisions. At any age a medical crisis could leave you too ill to make any healthcare decisions.

While many of us do not like to think that we will need such a plan, too often the lack of advance care planning can result in questioning, confusion, or disagreement among family members trying to envision what you would want if you were unable to speak for yourself. A plan relieves family members from wondering if they "did the right thing" on your behalf. A plan also provides your health care team with information on your health care preferences and if you would want life-sustaining measures if there appeared to be little likelihood of your recovery.

An important part of advance care planning involves having conversations with family members and other loved ones about what you would want in the event of a life-threatening illness or injury, and then, most importantly, documenting your preferences in writing through an instrument such as and advance directive.

An advance directive can include the name of the individual whom you have chosen to speak and make decisions on your behalf. This person, your "health care proxy" or "durable power of attorney for health care" should be someone you trust and someone who understands and will strive to honor and carry out your wishes.

Once you've completed your advance directive, ensure that copies are provided to your health care proxy, your health care providers, your hospital, and others whom you think should have the information. You may want to review your advance directive from time to time, but for the most part, once you have taken the important step to complete one, you can be comfortable knowing that your wishes and preferences are known, and thus much more likely to be followed.

On January 21st at 5:30 p.m. in the Parlor, Rev. Sara Schwarz, MA at Sanford Medical Center, will be here to speak on advance care planning. She also can help you prepare this legal document and submit it into your chart at the Sanford Medical Center or provide the legal document to you so that you can submit it to your own Healthcare Facility. This is a free service for you. You just have to call for an appointment and she will work with you in completing this document. 




DEACONS VISITS

PER CAPITA 2020

Per capita payments, which represent a contribution to the work of the Presbyterian church at all levels, offer a working example of Christian sharing. A request for a per-member contribution is also made by the Synod and by the General Assembly; the sum of those three amounts constitutes the total per capita payment. Each church is asked to pay the total per capita payment to the Presbytery, which then distributes the payments among the three recipients. This way, each Presbyterian church within the Presbyterian Church (USA), has the opportunity to share equally to promote the work of the Presbytery , the Synod, and also the General Assembly.

Per capita payments recognize the fact that we Presbyterians see ourselves as a collective part of the body of Christ. We are not separated by region or by distance, instead Presbyterians are a single body, faithfully sharing our resources at all levels of the church. By sharing in these expenses, the collective financial strength of all church members can be focused on issues which concern all Presbyterians, not only in our area, but throughout the country and the world.

The per capita payments for 2020 as approved by Presbytery of the Northern Plains are \$47.00 per member.

General Assembly (GA)	\$ 8.95
Synod of Lakes & Prairies	\$ 5.50
Northern Plains Presbytery	\$ 32.55
Total 2019 Per Capita	\$ 47.00

The faithful recognition of this financial contribution by each church is integral to the operation of the Presbytery, since the Presbytery makes the payment based on the number of church members in the Presbytery, to the Synod and General Assembly, even if a local church does not pay that church's per capita assessment.

SESSION HIGHLIGHTS DECEMBER 17TH, 2019

CLERK'S REPORT

The death of Dick Weber, December 4th was reported. Memorial service was held on December 16th. Total membership is 363.

Jim Skaret stated that there would be no transfers in 2019 from the Orr Family Fund or the Merritt Reserve Fund as there is no need to supplement the General Fund.

MODERATOR'S REPORT

Pastor Leanne will lead new Elder Training on January 11th. A special Session meeting will be held to examine and accept incoming Elders and Deacons. Long-term planning and restructuring of Session Committees will be the major focus in 2020.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Administrative and Personnel—Dale Hoerauf showed the new church logo that was designed by a graphic arts student at the Career Academy. The logos will be given to congregation members at the Christmas Eve services.

Session approved minor changes in the job description for the Christian Education Committee. The Committee is in the process of assigning Elders to chair/co-chair various committees. Dale Hoerauf agreed to remain as Chair of Administrative and Personnel and serve on Session for another year.

A discussion about setting up a sub-committee to propose fundraising for the Parish Nurse will be included in Elder Training.

Business and Finance—132 pledges have been received for \$330,136, an increase of \$36,406 over last year. There are a few more pledges that may be made for 2020.

Christian Education—Children's Christmas program was well-received. Volunteers are needed to teach Sunday School; curriculum is Growing in Grace and Gratitude.

Membership—The committee is planning for the lunch in connection with the Annual Meeting January 26th. Photos and bios of new members will be displayed in the near future.

Mission and Outreach—The committee has received a grant from Northern Plains Presbytery for a possible mission trip to Puerto Rico. The church will do Meals on Wheels in September rather than March. Any items not purchased for the Tree of Love will be covered by the committee.

Session Highlights



Property and Equipment—Dennis Rosenkranz explained that the snow removal contract included Pastor Leanne's driveway and sidewalks whenever the church parking lot is plowed. This was included in the 2020 budget.

Stewardship—The Christmas Eve offerings will go to the Parish Nurse Fund. "Giving Cards" will be in the pew racks to be used by members when the offering plates are passed. This indicates the person contributes to the church in other ways instead of each Sunday.

Child Care Center Board—Pancakes with Santa was a huge success with the Boy Scouts making the pancakes. Thanks to Pastor Leanne for making the puppets and to the C.E. Committee for all their assistance. Dennis Rosenkranz was a terrific Santa.
